Pilot Rock Triumphs In State B Encounter

Gray Stewart, Rogue River, picked up southern Oregon's only individual title Saturday in the state B track meet at Springfield.

He won the high jump at 5 feet 10 1/2 and was second in the broad jump to collect the bulk of the points for the Chieftains who finished eighth in team scoring.

Pilot Rock won the meet with 63 1/2 points, Wallowa was

second with 56 and Union third with 32.

Bill Carey got the lone points for St. Mary's of Medford's delegation winning third in the 880-yard run.

Central Point — Crater high school won the District 6 A-2 baseball championship here yesterday, defeating Douglas 4 to 3.

An overthrow on first base allowed in the winning run for the Comets with two men out in the 11th inning.

The victory sent the Comets into the state quarter-finals. They play Junction City there next Wednesday at 2 p.m.

With one out in the fourth extra panel here yesterday, Bill Reeves singled and Harold Lefler sacrificed. Fred Herrmann drilled the ball to Larry Bissenette at shortstop whose throw to first was bad. Reeves romped home for the winning tally.

Bob Gilman, Douglas pitcher, was stingy with the hits except in the fourth inning. In that frame doubles by Wayne Allen

and Neil Green, a three-bagger by Herrmann and a walk got the Comets three runs.

Overthrows at first, similar to the one on which Crater got its winning marker helped Douglas score three runs in the fourth canto also. There were four errors in the inning. Bill Rudzik and Bissenette got hits in the frame and there was a passed ball.

Herrmann, the Comet tosser, and Gilman each fanned 10 batters. Herrmann walked one and hit two and Gilman gave three bases on balls.

Allen hit for five and Reeves two for four for Crater and Rudzik socked three for five for the Trojans.

Redmond's Panthers Nab A-2 Cinder Meet

Wayne Christian, sophomore of Eagle Point, led southern Oregon entries in the state A-2 track and field meet at Corvallis yesterday by winning the javelin with a throw of 165 feet nine inches.

Crater's Comets, however, placed men in five events to produce 17 1/2 points. Christian was the only entry for his school. Jim Korth of Phoenix was fourth in the javelin, the only Pirate to gather points.

Places for the Comets were Craig Cochran, second in the high jump at 5-9, George Juveland third in the 220-yard dash, Bob Mason fifth in the broad jump with 20-4 1/2, and Jack Lilly sixth in the discus and Don Goyette, tied for fifth in the pole vault.

Redmond's Panthers rolled up 67 3/7 points for an impressive team triumph but the one man performance of Dave Edstrom of Sherwood and Cliff Thomson of Douglas stole the limelight in the meet.

WSC posted an 8-6 victory over Oregon at Pullman Friday on the strength of a 5-run first inning and a 3-run spurge in the fourth.

Four singles and three walks got the five runs in the initial frame. Doubles by Ron Roisy, Jack Hardman's triple and singles by Joe Tremblay, Bill Rich and a walk produced the three in the fourth.

Other Medford points came on

Neil Plumley's second place in the shot put, third spots by Mike Hawkins in the 100-yard sprint and Mike Russell in the quarter mile, a tie for third by Lew Breazeale in the pole vault and a tie for fourth by Dave Johnson in the high jump.

The Tornado stalwarts came through after a disheartening disqualification in the half-mile relay in Friday preliminaries.

The quartet, whose 1:32.5 time on Friday was the best of the meet and who surely would have picked up points Saturday in that event, were eliminated for passing out of lane.

The disqualification and failure of Eldon Francis, 1955 state champ, to qualify in the javelin "battle with the Beavers" just that much tougher for Medford high.

Jim Norval was the high scorer of the A-1 scramble, winning both dashes, placing fifth in the broad jump and running on the winning North Salem relay team.

North Salem's Vikings were the only ones other than Medford to get. The dash man had times of :10.1 in the century and :22.1 in the furlong. The Vikings ran the relay in 1:32.8.

Giberson Victor

Beaverton got two first places when Eric Giberson beat out Medford's Larson with :14.8 in the high hurdles and Glen Johnson put the shot out 57 feet 1 1/2 inches bettering a 55-2 1/2 shove by Plumley of the Tornado.

Eugene grabbed two firsts with LeRoy Poindexter taking the 440-run in :30.9 and Roger King the high jump at 6-1 3/4.

Alvin Erickson won the mile for North Bens in 4:31.5 while Pehro Colley of Klamath Falls won the sixcus with 158-7. Phil Paquin was victor in the pole vault for Grants Pass and Paul Bernick of Gresham won the javelin with 184-11.

Baker of Ashland finished thirn behind Hawkins in the 100 and was second to Norval in the 220. Grants Pass had two seconds with Mike in the mile and Larry McFarland in the javelin. Chuck Weller was third for the Cave-men in the broad jump and Terry Boatman was sixth in the mile. For Klamath Falls, Tom Farrell was fifth in the 440 and Dave Peppel fifth in the 220. The Pels were third in therelay.

Les Lingscheit of the Tornado who was sidelined this last week by a pulled achilles tendon finished about eighth in the half-mile.
