

# Portland Rose Festival Will Top List of Events Throughout State During June

Salem—Portland's Rose Festival and early harvest festivals top the list of June events published by the Oregon State Highway Department's Travel Information Division.

The internationally famous Rose Festival begins with the night show and coronation of the queen at Multnomah Stadium, Wednesday, June 6. The festival extends through Sunday with marine events at Lewis Park and the Golden Rose ski tournament at Mt. Hood, both beginning at 1 p.m. The Grand Floral Parade is to be held on Saturday, June 9, beginning at 9 a.m., moving into Multnomah Stadium and moving from the stadium at 10 a.m. Theme of the parade is Disneyland in Flowers this year.

### Parade Route Listed

Grand floral parade route is via S. W. Salmon st., 14th ave., Washington, 10th, Madison, Broadway, Oak, Fifth, Yamhill, river via the Burnside bridge, S. E. Grand ave., Morrison, 7th, Sandy blvd., S. E. 11th, N. E. Davis, and disbanding near Grant Bowl on N. E. 12th.

Other events during the festival include the night shows at Multnomah Stadium, art festival at Laurelhurst Park. The rose show daily at the Public Auditorium, and the Junior parade on Friday, (2 p.m.) June 8 on east side streets, starting from N. E. 52nd and Sandy.

### Buckaroo at Philomath

Philomath will hold its Third Annual Buckaroo and Loggers Frolic on June 9 and 10. The parade will be held June 9 and the Buckaroo on June 10.

The Azalea festival, Brookings, June 9-10, begins with a pet parade on Saturday morning and coronation of the Queen at 11:30 with music and dancing. The flower show opens at 2 p.m., Saturday, along with Kid's Kapers in Azalea Park. The festival closes Sunday with church services and barbecue in Azalea Park.

The "World's largest strawberry shortcake" at the Strawberry Festival, Lebanon, June 14-16, will be cut at 12 noon Friday, June 15, serving approximately 12,000 people. The cake is 12 feet wide by 16 feet long and stands 4 1/2 feet high with a combined weight of 5,358 pounds.

Other Strawberry Festival events include Junior Court Coronation at 3:30 p.m., and Royal Court coronation at 8 p.m., Thursday, June 14; grand parade, 11 a.m.; home show; flower show; berry exhibit; arts and craft exhibit; auto and machine show; and Rock Exhibit 1 p.m.; Band Concert 3 p.m.; Strawberry auction and softball games 7:30 p.m., Friday, June 15; and children's parade 11 a.m.; home show 12 noon; strawberry auction 4:30 p.m.; stage show 8 p.m. on Saturday, June 16.

Phil Sheridan Days at Sheridan begins on Thursday, June 21, through Sunday, June 24. On Friday the children's parade is scheduled at 11 a.m., with a park program following at 12 noon. Saturday sees the hot cake breakfast at 6 a.m., "Oregon's Greatest Historical Parade," 10 a.m., rodeo 1 p.m., Phil Sheridan dance 9 p.m., on Saturday and Phil Sheridan rodeo finals at 1 p.m., on Sunday.

### Rodeo at Sisters

The Annual Sisters rodeo will begin with the queen's ball at 9:30 p.m., on June 22. On June 23 a children's bridle horse contest and musical chairs contest will be held at 9:45 a.m.; parade at 11 a.m.; rodeo 1:30 p.m.; and buckaroo dance 9:30 p.m. On June 24 the annual buckaroo breakfast will be held from 6 to 10 a.m. with "All you can eat for a dollar." The finals in the rodeo will be at 1:30 p.m.

The first performance of the Mirror Pond Water Pageant at Bend will be held on the night of June 30 this year. Repeat performances at 8 p.m., will be held on the nights of July 4 and 7.

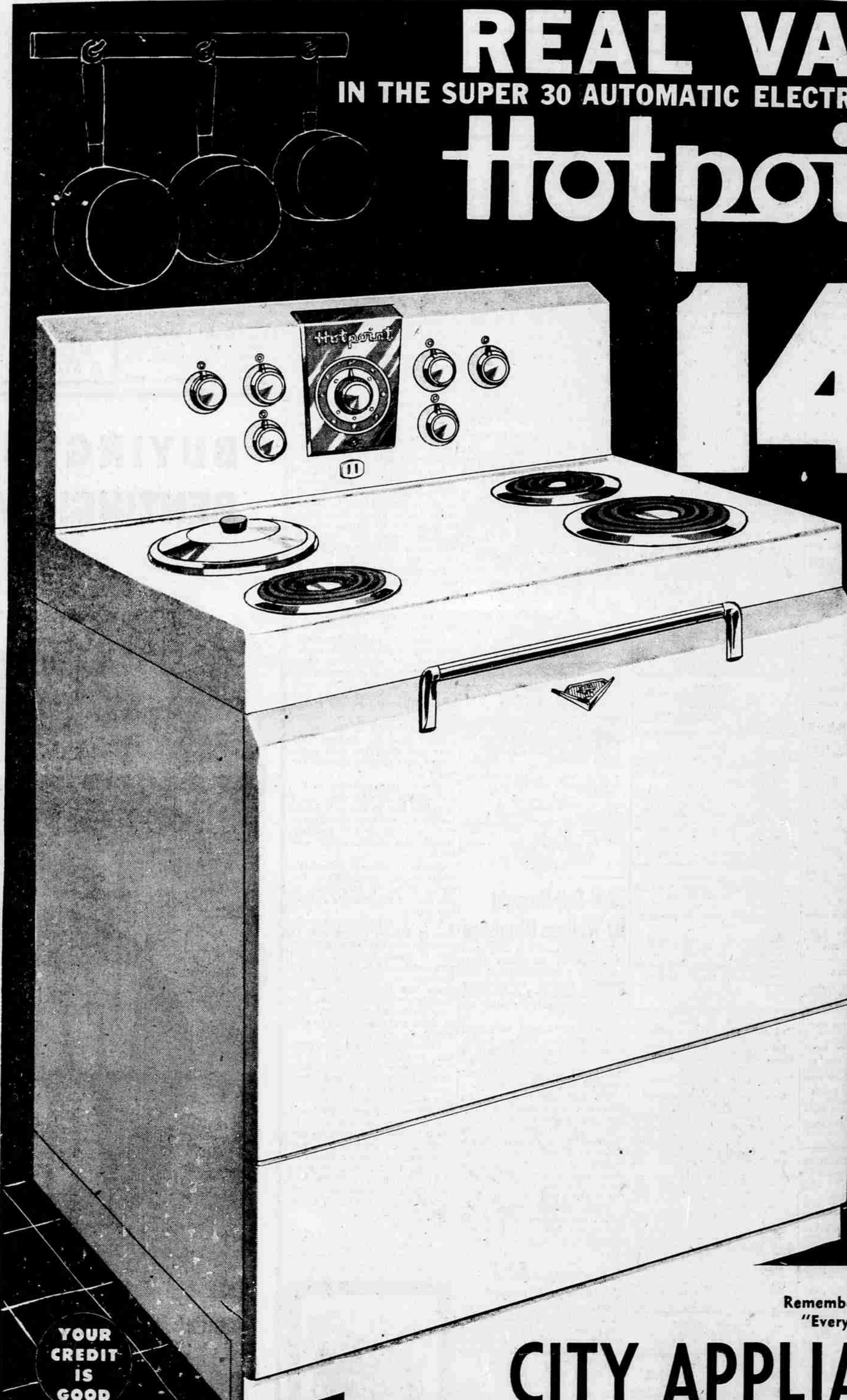
