Quarles said the invitation also was approved by Secretary of State John Foster Dulles and Secretary of Defense Charles E. Wilson.

Twining will be accompanied to Moscow by several Air Force officers of his own choosing.

### Stevenson 'Very Pleased' With Results From Florida Primary

Vallejo, Calif. — (U.P.) — Adlai Stevenson, expressing himself as "very pleased" with the results of the Florida presidential primary, called today on his supporters to "redouble their efforts" to ensure a victory in California's primary election next Tuesday.

A slate of delegates pledged to Stevenson is opposed to a slate pledged to Sen. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.) on the Democratic ballot in the June 5 election. Thus, the election is a "popularity contest" in which the winner gets all of the state's 68 convention votes.

#### Victory Statement

Stevenson spent last night at the Casa de Vallejo here to await the returns of the Florida primary. The race was nip and tuck for hours, but at last he pulled into a clear but slim margin over Kefauver.

It was shortly after 10 p.m. (PST) that Stevenson finally decided it was safe to issue a victory statement. He said:

"I am of course very pleased about the result in the Florida primary.

"I am deeply grateful to the people of Florida for their endorsement. And I am especially thankful to all those who helped me so loyally. Their efforts meant all the difference.

#### Redouble Efforts

"The California primary will be next Tuesday. I hope that those who feel as I do will see in the Florida results the importance of redoubling our efforts. Stevenson found an opportunity Tuesday to make one of his rare attacks on Kefauver. He said he was "surprised and resentful" that Kefauver should criticize his record on old age pensions while governor of Illinois.

#### A Higher Plane

He called on Kefauver to help him restore the campaign for the Democratic presidential nomination to a higher plane. Stevenson accused Kefauver of using pamphlets written by George McLean during the Florida campaign that "grossly distorted my record in Illinois."

### Sen. Kefauver Claims 'Moral Victory' in Florida Elections

spot with Stevenson—3 col head SEN. KEFAUVER—2 col head... Los Angeles — (U.P.) — A confident Sen. Estes Kefauver today claimed a "moral victory" in the Florida primary despite losing by a slim margin to his Democratic opponent, Adlai Stevenson.

"The vote shows I have strength in the South and I consider it a great moral victory," Kefauver said. "It was frankly much better than I expected under the circumstances."

The lanky presidential aspirant arrived here late Tuesday night by plane from Florida. He greeted reporters at the airport with a smile and seemed well-pleased with the outcome of the election.

"This vote breaks the so-called myth that the South won't support one of its own," he said. "It also breaks the myth that

Stevenson has a great deal more support than I have in the South." Kefauver said he would have more to say on the election after he studied the voting returns. The senator arrived here in a final campaign swing of California before the state's primary next Tuesday.

### Sen. Clements Builds Big Lead in Race for Kentucky Nomination

Louisville, Ky. — (U.P.) — Sen. Earle C. Clements built up a lead of nearly 90,000 votes over former Rep. Joe B. Bates today to win his battle for renomination on the Democratic ticket and for control of the Democratic party machinery in Kentucky.

The polls had been closed only an hour Tuesday, before machine-counted ballots in the state's major population centers showed the unmistakable sweep for Clements over the candidate backed by Gov. A. B. Chandler. At 8:10 p.m. (EDT), Bates' campaign manager Charles Blackburn conceded the Clements victory in a statement from Bates' headquarters in Frankfort.

With the vote counting about seven-eighths complete, the vote stood at 195,281 for Clements; 106,793 for Bates; and 1,554 for a third candidate, James L. Delk.

Returns were in from 3,530 of the state's 4,042 precincts. Republicans chose former Assistant Secretary of State Thurston B. Morton as their nominee to oppose Clements.

#### Incumbents Win

All eight incumbent Kentucky congressmen — six Democrats and two Republicans — won renomination by large margins, even though four of them were opposed by candidates backed by Chandler.

The voting in the Democratic primary was the heaviest in Kentucky since 1938, and the final total, swelled by 18-year-old residents voting for the first time, was expected to run well above the 300,000 mark.

Clements' victory Tuesday was in marked contrast to the defeat of the Clements' organization last year when Chandler won the Democratic nomination for governor and the governorship.

Ever since he took office last fall, Chandler has stated repeatedly that removal of Clements from the senate was one of the chief objectives of his administration. He issued a statement last night, however, congratulating Clements and pledging him support in the fall campaign.

Clements' victory assured him of retaining control of the Democratic party organization in Kentucky. He probably will be able to name the Democratic candidate for the unexpired Senate term of the late Alben W. Barkley.

It also meant that Chandler's hopes of going to the Democratic national convention as Kentucky's favorite son may depend on his willingness and ability to reach a compromise with Clements.

#### Dr. Stevenson Serving As Book Consultant

Ashland—Serving as one of the consultants for the current edition of the New Wonder Book Cyclopedia of World Knowledge, Dr. Elmo N. Stevenson, president of Southern Oregon college, also edited the sections on birds and mammals in the 12 volume set.

Dr. Stevenson, who is observing the 10th year of his presidency of the college, shared in writing general science articles concerning the philosophical aspects of science.
