Hollywood — Marilyn Monroe, on a columnist's printed "quote" from her that she planned to marry playwright Arthur Miller: "It is beyond my understanding how a responsible member of the press can print a statement attributed to me that was never made."

Washington — White House Press Secretary James C. Hagerty, on whether the United States is prepared to invite top Russian air force commanders to visit this country: "I don't know of any invitation."

Philadelphia — The Rev. Dr. Paul Calvin Payne, Presbyterian church official, on why the American home is taking a "terrible beating": "The American scene is like a giant merry-go-round with all the horses going in different directions."

Lisbon — Portuguese Premier Dr. Antonio de Oliveira Salazar, on the importance of Africa to Europe: "Africa is the natural complement of Europe . . . without Africa, Russia could dictate the terms on which the West would be permitted to exist."

Belgrade — Italian Communist Boss Palmiro Togliatti, on differences in the various Communist Party lines: "The line of Yugoslavia differs a lot from those of the Soviets and many other Communist countries, but still the aim is the same — building Socialism."

## Noted Novelist Warns Racial Equality Slavery's Alternative

Philadelphia — William Faulkner warned today that all white people who are still free must practice racial equality or they will be made slaves by the "massed myriads of all the people on earth who are not white."

The Mississippi novelist said "because it makes a glib and simple picture, we like to think of the world situation today as a precarious and explosive balance of two irreconcilable ideologies confronting each other."

"Fact of Man"

"That's not so," he wrote in an article on segregation in the June issue of Harper's magazine. "Only one of the opposed forces is an ideology. The other one is that simple fact of Man: that simple belief of individual man that he can and should and will be free. And if we who are still free want to continue so, all us

who are still free had better confederate, and confederate fast, with all others who still have a choice to be free—confederate not as black people nor white people nor blue or pink or green people, but as people who still are free, with all other people who are still free; confederate together and stick together too, if we want a world or even a part of a world in which individual man can be free, to continue to endure.

"And we had better take in with us as many as we can get of the non-white peoples of the earth who are not completely free yet but who want and intend to be, before that other force which is opposed to individual freedom—even when ignorant from inferior or no education, even despite the record of his history of inequality, he still believes in our concepts of freedom and democracy."

Turning to the situation in the South today, the writer said the white man in the South is afraid that the Negro, "who had done so much with no chance, might do so much more with an equal one that he might take the white man's economy away from him, the Negro now the banker or the merchant or the planter and the white man the sharecropper or the tenant. That's why the Negro can gain our country's highest decoration for valor beyond all call of duty for saving or defending or preserving white lives on foreign battle fields, yet the Southern White man dares not let that Negro's children learn their ABC's in the same classroom with the children of the white lives he saved or defended."

**Church is Quiet**

Faulkner also said everybody is voicing their opinion on segregation except the Southern church—"the church, which is the strongest unified force in

our Southern life since all Southerners are not white and are not democrats, but all Southerners are religious and all religions serve the same single God, no matter by what name He is called."

He asked: "Where is this voice now, in our time of trouble and indecision? Is it trying by its silence to tell us that it has no validity and wants none outside the sanctuary behind its symbolical spire?"

### Smith Speaks on American Heritage

Depoe Bay, Ore. — (U.P.) — Gov. Elmo Smith warned a Memorial day crowd at Depoe Bay's annual Fleet of Flowers yesterday that taking America's heritage of liberty and justice for granted "is the first step in losing this heritage."

"The right to vote, to take part in the processes of government, to speak and worship as we wish—these things did not just happen, nor did they come easily to us," Gov. Smith said.

"The strength of a nation does not lie in its treasury balance, or in its natural resources, or in the size of its armed forces, the governor pointed out.

"The strength of a nation lies in the character and fiber of its people, in their willingness to sacrifice personal gain and personal comfort for their country's welfare, in their willingness to work together for the common good and, in the last extremity, in their willingness to lay down their lives in defense of the principles for which their country stands," Gov. Smith said.

### Methodist Conference Will Study Campsite

Portland — (U.P.) — The Oregon Methodist conference yesterday voted to study the feasibility of joint ownership of Walla Walla Lake campsite with the Idaho and Pacific Northwest conferences.

The Idaho conference now owns and operates the 140-acre campsite. Last week the Idaho conference voted to offer joint ownership to the Oregon and Pacific Northwest conferences. Washington and the Idaho panhandle make up the Pacific Northwest conference.

Wednesday's vote by the Oregon conference means that the proposed joint ownership plan will get extensive investigation for one year. At the 1957 conference a report on the Idaho offer will be given.

The Oregon Conference is holding its four-day meeting at First Methodist church in Portland.

Detroit — (U.P.) — Edgar A. Guest, long-time poet laureate of the Detroit Free Press, was in "fair" condition today at New Grace Northwestern hospital. Guest was admitted to the hospital Monday when he suffered a "weak spell."

### Marilyn Monroe Denies Wedding Plan

Hollywood — (U.P.) — Film star Marilyn Monroe has denied that she has any plans to marry her occasional New York escort, playwright Arthur Miller.

The curvaceous blonde Wednesday refused to either confirm or deny that she and Miller, now in Nevada to obtain a divorce, are having a romance. New York gossip columns, however, have itemed for several months that the two had been dating.

One columnist Wednesday quoted Marilyn as saying she would marry Miller and that she had informed 20th Century-Fox Studio of her plans. But at her apartment Marilyn announced:
