The Medical Roundup

Mr. Cotsakis writes me that he had a geographical tongue and went to several doctors who, like me, did not know of any good treatment. He then painted his tongue twice a day with tincture of iodine and in a week he was well. Another kind person wrote that he went to a quack who pulled on his neck and in a few weeks his tongue was well. Still another friend of my column writes that his grandmother had him tie on his little finger a red woolen

thread, and soon he was well. Still another reader, a physician, writes that he had a geographical tongue, and it never occurred to him to take any medicine at all. But in six weeks he was well! I am sure that now all persons with a geographical tongue will know exactly how to treat themselves!

Allergy in Breast-Fed Infants

Dr. Norman W. Clein, of Seattle, whose valuable article on allergy I recently commented on, writes me that babies, even from highly allergic families, if they are nursed at the breast for a while, have only one-seventh as great a chance of developing a serious allergy as do those who are raised on a bottle. This is what I suspected would be true.

The Need for Research in Child Psychology

Recently, I read a complaint by some of America's leading pediatricians to the effect that they did not have any scientific proof to back up the pronouncements of some psychiatrists as to the new ways of caring for children. The pediatricians did not know of anyone who had studied the results of bringing up 100 children in the new way, and then had compared these results with those obtained by bringing up 100 children in the old way. Until such studies are made, like these pediatricians, I will have no faith in the statements of theorists.

The Senate planned to resume debate on the bill after putting it aside to pass the multi-billion dollar highway program.

The narcotics bill would authorize death sentences for persons selling heroin to juveniles and persons convicted three times of selling it to adults.

The bill also would permit use of wire-tap evidence in prosecution of narcotics cases. That provision has brought on the floor fight.
