Washington—(U.P.)—Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore.) said yesterday that he does not believe President Eisenhower should run for re-election in view of his health. But he said he does not know what the president's decision will be.

Neuberger said on ABC's "College Press Conference" television program that the president's health, rather than "political considerations," should be the first factor in determining whether he should seek a second term.

He said that if the president does make the race, his health automatically will be an issue "without being made one" by the Democratic candidate. He added that Mr. Eisenhower's health will be "in the people's mind" during the campaign.

Portland Girl Drowns In Hood River Sunday

Hood River—(U.P.)—A 10-year-old Portland girl drowned Sunday when she tumbled down a rain slickened bank into the south fork of Hood River about 17 miles southwest of the town of Hood River.

Dead was Donna Bacon, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Roy Bacon. Sheriff Rupert Gilmore reported that the little girl was with her father and a cousin who were fishing along the stream.

The last time she was seen was when she left to follow the cousin, Kenneth Christensen, Tigar, upstream.

The death was the third child drowning in Hood River in the past month. A young girl drowned in the stream May 13 and a boy lost his life in the river May 20.

Plane Wreckage Found in Alaska

Anchorage, Alaska—(U.P.)—Wreckage of a private plane, missing since Friday with five persons aboard, has been located in a mountainous area near here and first reports said there were "no indications of survivors."

The plane, piloted by Capt. Elbert G. Head of the Alaskan Air Command headquarters here, had last been heard from Friday morning. Head had reportedly purchased the Howard Air Craft in Washington, D.C., and was believed en route here from Dallas, Tex. The plane was reported to have left Dallas Tuesday.

The four passengers aboard were identified as Mrs. J. C. Head, the captain's mother; Mrs. George Hogue, W. K. Tanner, all of Birmingham, Ala., and Mrs. W. Hess, Dallas.

The wreckage was sighted by a plane from the 71st Air Reserve squadron at Elmendorf Air Force base here.

Stalingrad Cheers Tito's Arrival

Moscow—(U.P.)—Yugoslav President Tito was wildly cheered yesterday at Stalingrad when he said his Communist country must march "shoulder to shoulder" with the Soviet Union toward the "victory of socialism."

Tito made his remarks as he stood alongside Soviet Communist party chief Nikita Khrushchev in 102-degree heat at Stalingrad's lavishly decorated station. Radio Moscow said Tito was cheered and applauded by "hundreds of thousands" of Stalingrad citizens as he continued his good will tour of Russia.

"I wish you, dear Comrades," Tito said, "many successes in your constructive and creative work to achieve an even better life and for the victory of Communism throughout the Soviet Union."

"In peace as in war, Yugoslavia must march shoulder to shoulder with the Soviet People towards the same goal, the goal of the victory of socialism."

Silverston—(U.P.)—The Rev. Arnold W. Nelson, for the past five years pastor of Immanuel Lutheran church here, yesterday announced to his congregation that he was resigning to accept a call from Our Savior's church in Milwaukee, Wis.
