

# Yankees' Grim Bedazzles Chicago 5-1; Red Sox Knock Indians, Braves Beat Giants

The Yankees were looking high and low for another pitcher as "pennant insurance" and it may be they've finally found him today in Bob Grim, a right hander who some people were beginning to think was just another of those one-year wonders.

Relegated to the bullpen earlier this season when he failed to impress anyone, the 26-year-old Grim turned in by far his best performance of the campaign Thursday, defeating the White Sox 5-1, and stretching the Yankees' lead in the American League to five games.

Grim, a 20-game winner in 1954 and the American League "rookie of the year" spent part of last year on the disabled list and wound up with an ordinary 7-5 record.

**Nine Whiffs**  
Grim, who had not pitched a complete game victory since May 29, 1955 when he beat Baltimore, 1-0, struck out nine White Sox batters, walked only one and gave up four hits. Chicago's only run came as a result of a fourth-inning homer by Dave Philley, who was ejected from the game in the sixth because of a stormy third-strike protest.

Mickey Mantle led a 10-hit attack with his 22nd homer and a double, his homer off loser Jim Wilson in the fourth putting him one game ahead of Babe Ruth's record pace again. For Grim, it was his fourth victory without a defeat while Wilson suffered his third loss against eight victories.

**Red Sox Win**  
Only two other games were played in the majors Thursday with the Red Sox outlasting the Indians, 10-9, and the Braves beating the Giants, 5-2.

Jackie Jensen drove in four runs and Dick Gernert three in Boston's triumph, which was credited to Ike Delock. Jensen hit a three-run homer off Bob Lemon in the third inning and before he left the scene Lemon was trailing 8-3. The Red Sox scored what proved to be the de-

cisive runs in the fifth on Don Buddin's double, a sacrifice, Jim Pierrall's triple and Gernert's single.

Southpaw Warren Spahn, who had not won a game since May 17, struck out 10 batters and walked only one in nailing down

his fourth victory. Spahn scattered seven hits and Willie Mays collected three of them, a homer and two singles.

Del Crandall hit a two-run home run off loser Ruben Gomez to tie the score at 2-all in the fifth inning and the Braves

wrapped up the contest with two more runs in the sixth.

Omaha, Neb.—(U.P.)—The University of Minnesota baseball team headed back home as the 1956 national collegiate champion by virtue of a thumping 12-1 victory over Arizona.

Powerful Gopher hitters pounded three Arizona hurlers for 14 hits Thursday night in producing the biggest rout of the 15-game NCAA collegiate series. Hill Horning paced the Minnesota sluggers with a home run in the fifth inning and another in the seventh.

The only Arizona run crossed the plate in the sixth frame on a walk, an error and a passed ball.

### Picture Fighter Favored Tonight

New York—(U.P.)—Handsome Cherif Hamia, the French "picture fighter" whose ambitions are focused on the featherweight crown, is favored at 8-5 to beat fiery, sawed-off Miguel Berrios of Puerto Rico tonight in their TV-radio 10-rounder at Madison Square garden.

Trim, dimpled Hamia risks his third ranking among 126-pound contenders and his unbeaten string of 11 against prestige in the Garden main event.
