The Medical Roundup

One of the common distresses of man is heartburn. It tends to be inherited and it comes in spells. It appears to be due to regurgitation of gastric contents into a gullet that has previously been irritated or made over-sensitive in some way. A person with heartburn shows me with his hand that the burning starts in the upper central area of the abdomen, and then runs up under his breast-bone, perhaps as far as his throat.



From much study of patients with this trouble I am satisfied that it is rarely due to any organic disease, such as an ulcer or cancer or gallstones. It never turns into anything. Attacks come and go, often without any explanation that the patient can see. In other cases the person says he can always get heartburn by eating too much, or eating certain foods, or drinking certain drinks, or smoking too much, or smoking some particular brand of tobacco. Some say that they will get an attack of heartburn, lasting several days, whenever they "blow their top."

The patients tell me that the best treatment is to take a little baking-soda and dissolve it in half a glass of water and then sip that. This alkaline water neutralizes the acid in the gullet and washes much of it back into the stomach, where it cannot be felt. A tablet or two of some anti-acid drug does not work so

Agronomists Are Impressed in Valley

Parsons and Mercer, who were especially interested in production of marion bluegrass, pen-lawn fescue and polycross bents, spent the morning at Bohnert's farm. During the afternoon they visited Wallace Rice, manager of the Josephine County Cooperative.

to discuss with them the patient's problem. Often, the spouse had very important things to say, things which he or she knew the patient was not confessing to the analyst. Many a time, also, the spouse very much needed expert guidance as to what he (or she) could do or should do each day to help the patient. In many cases the poor spouse did not know what to do during those terribly difficult days when the patient was irrational.

It is hard to explain the perversity of a physician who will behave in this way. Perhaps he is treating a mildly psychotic husband, who gets by at the office well enough and is well respected in the community, but at home is a devil who even attacks his wife and children.

What is the poor wife going to do about this? How should she try to handle the situation? Is there anything she could do to get along better with her husband? Is there any way in which she can lessen his hostility? Should she take the children and separate from him? Many such questions arise.

has not come down, and he should do something about it. If both testicles are left in the abdomen they will not develop properly, and the boy will grow up sterile. He will not be able to have children. There is also a risk that a testicle left in the abdomen will some day become cancerous. What is very bad is that the boy who has no testicles in his sac will be jeered at by his swimming companions. Then he will become moody and solitary. He will become mildly psychotic, and will not go out with girls. This situation can be relieved by an operation in which the testicles will—possibly—be brought down. Sometimes the artery to the testicle is so short the operation cannot be successful.
