### The Heredity of Deafness

Deaf persons whose loss of hearing is a family trait will be interested in an article by Louis A. Hopkins, of the research department of the Clarke School for deaf children, in Northampton, Massachusetts. Some 74 per cent of the children in this school appear to have inherited their deafness. In 4 per cent more cases the cause seemed to be congenital. In a few cases the cause was German measles. Another fairly common cause was meningitis. In some cases the cause could not be determined.

Miss Hopkins, while admitting that experts still haven't enough knowledge so that they speak dogmatically about the causes of deafness, feels it is their duty to give young deaf persons and their families the benefit of the knowledge which is now available. This can help the young people, especially when they are thinking of marrying, either another deaf person or a hearing person. Then they will be wondering if any children they

may have will be deaf, and if so, what percentage will be deaf. Also, will deafness appear in the grandchildren and great-grandchildren. An expert in this field may be able to tell them what these chances are.

It is important that persons who have inherited deafness know that their handicap can be transmitted through persons who hear, as well as through members of the family who are deaf. They should know, also, that the risk to children is high when a person in a deaf family marries someone who also comes from a deaf family. Deaf persons should know that a child who has been deafened by meningitis or measles may also be a carrier of familial deafness. Inquiry may show that his grandfather or his father had a brother or a sister who was deaf.

### Man Who Quits One Drug And Starts Using Another

Ever since I was intern 50 years ago, I have been interested in the fact that when a man of a certain nervous type gets a few doses of morphine, he soon wants to have many more. If he gets them, he soon is habituated. Then his relatives make a tremendous effort to get him off of the drug. But when "cured," what is he likely to do? He is likely to try some other sedative drug to relieve his nervousness or some pain that he has, and quickly he is likely to get "hooked" with that.

Again, after great effort on the part of his physician and his family, he is gotten off of this drug, and again, later, I hear that he is taking another drug in excessive dosage.

What this means is that most persons in this world can hardly get a habit. They don't want it, and will not let themselves slip into it. A friend of mine, a physician, who because of a very painful abscess in one of the sinuses of his nose had to take large doses of morphine every day for 6 weeks. The minute the abscess broke and he got relief, he quit taking morphine, and never wanted it again. On the other hand, I have known any number of persons who in the hospital after an operation insisted on having morphine several times a day long after they showed no sign of pain.

The important point, then, is that the strong-willed, normal type of person with a good, nor-

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mal nervous system, and nothing but good, sensible people in his family, need not be afraid of having to take, for a time, a barbiturate sleeping medicine, or even a pain-killing medicine. He is not at all likely to get a habit.

But a man who has always felt insecure, who has always adjusted poorly to life, who has always been rather afraid of life and the worrisome things that happen in the world, a person who has always felt the need for some sort of a crutch on which to lean, is likely to become habituated quickly when given any strong sedative. And once he is habituated, he is in a bad way because, although he can be gotten off the drug, he is likely to go back to taking it or some substitute for it.

Things We Physicians Do That Frighten Patients  
The other day a woman told me how terribly frightened she

had been when at a clinic a prominent physician showed the doctors sitting in the benches that the child had a fissured tongue, with deep furrows on the top of it. The poor woman thought that this must mean some terrible thing. Unfortunately, the doctor did not think to go on and tell the woman that there are thousands of people with a fissured tongue who never come to any bad end because of it. With time, the furrows may become less deep.

The woman went home and saw her physician who said, "Forget it. I know of no treatment for that, or any need for treating it." Finally, she went to a quack who guaranteed a cure but first extracted from her most of the family's savings. Now, the fissuring of the child's tongue is not so marked, and the quack is getting much credit.
