Perhaps some day a skin specialist will take a little electric brush and, after anesthetizing her skin, will plane off these rough places and make her skin smooth again.

What she tells me is that, for a long time, she avoided her classmates, even when they tried to be friendly with her. She avoided them because she thought they were just pitying her and trying to be kind. And so she remained solitary and would never go to a dance.

Then, one day, she went through a hospital for the blind where she found that many of these handicapped people—so much more handicapped than she was—were happy; they were wonderful; they talked of the beauty they felt all around them;

Klamath Indian Land To Be Offered for Sale

Klamath Agency—(U.P.)—About 10,000 acres of residential property, farm land, timber and grazing land is being offered for sale by Klamath Indians at Sprague River, Beatty, Chiloquin and Klamath Agency.

The 71 items of allotment property on the reservation will be offered on a bid basis, according to A. W. Galbraith, reservation superintendent. Bids will be opened July 17.
