William Muchow served as best man for his brother and ushers were Robert Daugherty, Daryl Carlson and Paul Roley, all Portland.

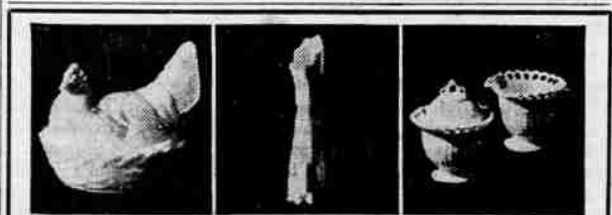
