

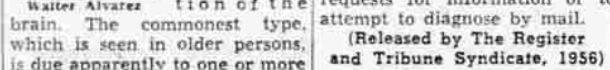

The Medical Roundup

Parkinson's Disease. Some persons ask if Parkinson's disease is ever hereditary. Actually, there is a form that appears to be hereditary in nature. Another form which appears in the first half of life is due to an attack of encephalitis or "brain fever," or inflammation of the brain.

In Parkinson's disease the person generally gets a poker-face without much expression; his muscles may feel stiff, as if there were glue in them; he may walk with short hesitating steps and he may shove his feet along as he walks; he is likely to hold one or both hands close his groin in front, and he may keep shaking his thumb and first two fingers together as in the so-called shaking palsy.

Thus far no good cure has been found for this disease. Some brain surgeons are trying to stop the tremor by injecting alcohol into a certain spot in the brain, but as yet this is experimental, and it is likely to help only those young persons whose palsy is due to an attack of brain fever; it is not being used for older persons who have had little strokes.

There are a number of drugs that are used with the idea of stopping the tremor and relieving the distress. Some drugs help in some cases, but I fear that in most cases they do not do much good. The patient's physician can try one after the other with the hope of finding

one that will help. Fortunately, many persons with the milder forms of this disease keep at work for years, and their brain stays clear. Some with the more severe forms are very miserable and cannot do much. Their hope must be that either better drugs will be found or a useful operation on the brain will be perfected.

Authority Orders Reduction of Fallout

Portland—(U.P.)—The Oregon State Air Pollution authority Friday ordered two Coos county lumber firms to reduce excessive cinder fallout within 30 days or be cited for violation of state pollution laws.

The hearing in Portland followed numerous complaints against Cape Arago Lumber Mill of Empire and Coos Bay Lumber company.

Vice President D. H. Miller of the Empire firm told the authority his firm would cooperate with the air pollution staff in meeting specific recommendations for eliminating the heavy discharge from the mill.

Representatives of the Coos Bay county did not appear before the board. The authority authorized the secretary to send a letter to the firm asking cooperation in eliminating fallout that covers Eastside near the mill.

The authority also heard complaints of air pollution from residents against Pacific Adhesives Company, Beaverton; Santiam Lumber Company, Sweet Home; Dugdale Nut Processing Company, Cornelius; Umpqua Plywood Corporation, Myrtle Creek; Labish Cold Storage Company, Marion county; Trumbull Asphalt Roofing, Portland; Cargill Grain Company, Clackamas county; The Dalles Lumber Company, The Dalles; and Borden Milk Company, Albany.

Revolt Reported by 1,000 Slave Laborers

Taipei, Formosa—(U.P.)—More than 1,000 slave laborers revolted in Red China, killed their Communist supervisors and fled to the mountains late last month, a Chinese Nationalist news agency reported Saturday.

The unofficial Tatro agency, quoting unidentified sources behind the "bamboo curtain," said the revolt took place May 25 among slave laborers working on a "reclamation team" in Nienkiang Province, bordering on North Korea.

The agency said the laborers, after killing their guards, grabbed all available weapons and took to the hills. They set forest fires that night to frustrate pursuing Communist troops, Tatro said. More than 1000 square miles of forest area were destroyed, the agency added.

Coalition Parties Agree on New Cabinet. Vienna, Austria (U.P.)—Austria's two coalition parties agreed on a new cabinet Friday, giving the new Ministry of Defense to the conservatives.

There were no changes in the old ministries, with the conservative Peoples party holding five and the Socialists four. The conservatives filled the new defense post because of their gains in the general election last month.

Berkeley, Calif.—(U.P.)—A "pretty strong" earthquake, believed centered in the remote wastes of Siberia, was recorded here Friday night.

Leaders See New Lutheran Church

Minneapolis, Minn.—(U.P.)—Leaders of the Evangelical Lutheran church said Saturday the way appears clear for formation of a new Lutheran denomination with two million members.

The new denomination would be composed of the Evangelical Lutheran church, the American Lutheran church and the United Evangelical Lutheran church.

The last barrier to the merger was believed to be hurdled Friday when more than two-thirds of the 2000 delegates attending the ELC's biennial convention voted in favor of joining the World Council of Churches.

ELC President Dr. Fredrik Shlotz of Minneapolis told the delegates that American Lutheran church leaders felt there could be no merger unless the new church would belong to the council.

Coast Guard Searches For Wrecked Plane

New York—(U.P.)—The Coast Guard cutter Gentian searched the ocean of the Jersey coast Saturday for the wreckage of the Venezuelan airliner which crashed Wednesday, killing 74 persons.

The Coast Guard vessel was using sonar equipment in an effort to detect the wreckage on the ocean floor.

The Venezuelan government has asked the U.S. Navy for divers to bring up the wreckage when it has been located. But it appeared likely the wreckage might never be found as the plane exploded upon hitting the water, shattering it into pieces.
