Not Enough Money For A Needed Operation

A man with such a small income that he has little chance of saving much tells me he needs an operation, for which his surgeon asks \$500. After paying the hospital fees he doubts if any of his savings will be left, and so he wonders what he should do.

There are thousands of persons like this man who, while they certainly do not want charity, are unable to pay a large fee. I feel that they should not try to do it. Usually, in such cases, a kindly surgeon will help by paring down his fee so that it will better fit the size of the person's purse. In some large cities there are clinics in which a patient can pay as much for his care as he can afford. In every city there are kindly surgeons who will operate on poor children for nothing; they will make no charge for repairing a hare-lip or defective hip-joints.

I will never forget years ago, on the day before Christmas, stepping into a hospital room to see a patient who, ten days previously, had been operated on by a kindly surgeon. A frail little unmarried woman of 50, she was largely dependent on her non-too-strong older sister, an assistant librarian.

Finding the patient crying quietly, I asked her what was wrong. She said, "Nothing is wrong; I am crying for joy. My surgeon was just in and, with a smile, he said, 'I have a Christmas present for you.' Expecting perhaps some little thing like a card, I asked, 'What is it?' and he replied, 'Your operation; I am giving you that for Christmas.' Now I am weeping because a tremendous weight of worry has been lifted from my mind; now my sister will not have to go so deeply into her little hoard of savings. It had been distressing me terribly to think that I would have to add so greatly to her anxieties for the future."

We gave a party for them and invited some of our friends and some of their friends. There was drinking, and our daughter-in-law, who had been in-law without hostility and without condescension. She should be prepared for surprising information. It can be that her husband had done something to upset her and throw her off balance.

Silence and evasion will contribute nothing, however. The girl's behavior was a conspicuous affront that needs explaining and mending. It cannot be put down as an unimportant incident, since it probably reflects some deep problem of maladjustment. It is far better to look into matters now than to realize later that timely effort might have saved an endangered marriage.

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Belle—If we remain silent, we condone what went on. I do not go prying into their affairs, but this occurred in our home, right under our noses.

Aside from this is the fact the incident occurred right after their return from their honeymoon. I can't help thinking that these young people have a problem we should draw them out on. If we do not show an interest in solving their problem, who will?

The Council: Silence is certainly not any solution. "Interfering" is a bad word, but so is "indifference" and so is "condoning." People cannot make the essential adjustments of everyday life by deciding all questions according to sweeping slogans.

At the very least, the daughter-in-law owes an apology for her unseemly behavior. If it has not occurred to her to offer an apology, it is necessary to call the problem to her attention. It may be that she feels the need to talk with her parents-in-law but does not know how to begin.

It would be well to discuss the matter with the girl when her husband is not present, and it would probably be wise to ask her whether or not she would like her father-in-law to be present.

Lausche May Vote For GOP in Senate

Atlantic City, N. J. — (U.P.) — Gov. Frank J. Lausche of Ohio, an irregular Democrat, has indicated he might vote for Republican control of the Senate if he is elected to that chamber next November.

Lausche gave this hint to newsmen as the annual conference of governors buckled down to business with an exchange of ideas about public education.

The five-term Ohio governor is seeking the seat now held by Republican Sen. George H. Bender. One of the arguments made by Bender forces is that his election is necessary to help the GOP regain control of the Senate if President Eisenhower is reelected.

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Neuberger Bill Draws Opposition

Washington—(U.P.)—Sen. Richard L. Neuberger's proposed amendment to the Western water rights bill has been opposed by the Portland Chamber of Commerce.

The amendment would have the effect of suspending Federal Power Commission licenses on a number of uncompleted hydroelectric dam projects until the FPC finds that the dams are being built in conformity with state law. The Pelton dam on the Deschutes river in Oregon would be one of these.
