

Oregon Guard Pilots Die in Plane Crash

Boise—(U.P.)—Two Oregon air National Guard fliers were killed yesterday when their F-94B jet fighter had a power failure on takeoff at Boise's Gowen field and they bailed out at an altitude too low for their parachutes to open.

The pilot of the craft was identified as Capt. Wallace Parks, 34, Portland and 2nd Lt. John G. Kominoth, 27, of Bay City. Both were attached to the 233rd fighter squadron of Portland.

Maj. J. P. Blair, public information officer of the 142nd air defense wing, said the plane "flamed out" on takeoff. The pilot tried to circle to land the ship but the two men bailed out when they saw they could not make it back to Gowen field.

The pair bailed out at an altitude of 200 feet, which was too low to give their parachutes time to open.

The crippled jet crashed into a small hill about two miles south of the air strip.
