

Is That So?

Did you know that... most flowers in Japan lack scent. Even such fragrant flowers as the rose, violet and carnation lose most of their scent within a year or two after their importation. Maybe the wet climate has something to do with it.

When hens are kept in a temperature of about 55 degrees and a relative humidity of 70 per cent, they produce the most eggs.

A tuna, tagged north of Hawaii, was recaptured near Japan, 2,370 miles away, 471 days later.

King Hiram of Tyre who furnished much of the wood for King Solomon's temple is generally regarded as the first great lumber merchant.

Because parrots occasionally carry the deadly psittacosis (par-



rot disease), their importation was barred until recently. Actually, this rare virus disease may be transmitted by several kinds of birds. Fortunately the disease has yielded to the modern antibiotics.

Goatsuckers—a large family of birds—were given this name by the Greeks from the belief that these birds use their huge mouths to suck milk from goats. This is no basis whatever for this belief. The true function of their big mouths is to engulf night-flying insects. In fact, it is not uncommon for one of these birds to fly, mouth agape, right into a swarm of insects. Large bristles extending from the corners of the mouth help rake them in.

Heat Lost Through Head

A man at rest produces heat equal to that given off by a 100-watt bulb, according to Physiologists G. Froese and Alan C. Burton of the University of Western Ontario. When the head is hatless in cold weather, more than half the body heat may be lost through the top of the head. Hence if the head is not insulated at least as well as the body, a man will get colder faster. See now how appropriate the Eskimo parka is for cold country.

To retain body heat, beards do not help much, either, these researchers reported. Although a beard can lower the heat loss the effect is often canceled out by an increase in the blood flow to the face because the skin under the beard has been kept warmer.

Although the "carrier" or "homing pigeon"—a domesticated bird bred in—justly famed for its homing feats, it has actually less homing ability than many, many wild birds. With training, however, it quickly becomes proficient—the maximum homing distance being in the neighborhood of 1,200 miles.

Dreams May Last an Hour

Although it is commonly believed that dreams flash by almost instantaneously, two Chicago physiologists contend that dreams may last an hour or more; an average person may dream two hours a night; and—as expected—the chances of remembering the dream decrease the longer he sleeps after the dream ends.

Researchers William Dement and Nathaniel Kleitman used eye movements as a key to dreams—the eye movements detected by electrodes attached to the eyelids. They found that vertical eye movements indicate that the dream in progress involves climbing or falling; horizontal, that the dreamer is following the actions of dream figures across a scene. Dreamers awakened five minutes after a flurry of eye movements had far clearer recollections of dreams than those allowed a 15-minute lapse.

Carved wood figures 6,000 years old have been found in the tombs of ancient Egypt; in fact, glued wood panels were interred with the body of King Tut. But as for the oldest wooden building in continuous use, that honors goes to the 1,349-year old Horyu-ji temple, Nara, Japan.
