Medford's Cheney Studs go into their third series of the Southern Oregon Baseball league this week and carrying a 2-27 team batting average for their first six loop encounters.

The Studs will oppose Coos Bay-North Bend on the North Bend diamond. Two games are scheduled Saturday—in the afternoon and evening—and one on Sunday in the afternoon. Drain will go to Bend for a similar series also this week end.

The Studs will be out to improve on their current third place standing and will have to win at least two of their three games to accomplish that mission. A number of outstanding shooters from both Oregon and California will contend here Saturday and Sunday in the annual smallbore rifle championship shoot of the Oregon Rifle and Pistol association.

Medford Rifle and Pistol club is host for the shoot for the first time. Contention will start at 8 a.m. Saturday and 7 a.m. Sunday at the club's outdoor range west of the Crater Lake highway.

A preliminary entry list of some 30 participants was reported yesterday by the local club. The list was expected to mount today. Post entries are being accepted, match officials said.

The current list includes the two top shooters in recent National Rifle association regional match at San Francisco. They are C. L. Wood, Bellflower, Calif., the winner, and George Hendrix, Etna, Calif., runner-up.

Winner of a spring smallbore rifle shoot here a year ago, Virgil Hamlin, Portland, is an entry. He is now stationed at Lowry Air Force Base. Other California entries include a pair of master shooters, Fred Dunkin, Mariposa, and R. N. Burkhardt, Hermosa Beach. Both are always contenders in California.

Burkhardt won a registered event at Long Beach last month.

Russel Cornelius, Portland, and Harvey Mutch, Enterprise, are among Oregon master shooters entered. Another Portland entry is Lee Swem, who makes bedders for guns. William Schiltz, Springfield, and Lee Brentlinger, Eugene, are two others rated among top entries.

Mrs. Florene P. Bolton and Jerry Smith, Medford, and Archie Haskins, Ashland, are said to be top local contestants.
