The Medical Roundup

Vaccine for Colds, Influenza

Army medical men reported recently that they had prepared a vaccine which, in Fort Dix, New Jersey, cut down the incidence of influenza, virus pneumonia and bad colds by 80 per cent.

This, of course, is tremendously important in the Army, just as it is in civil life. At Fort Dix, in the past winter, 20 per cent of all the men had to go to the hospital because of some respiratory disease. The vaccine, tried out on 350 persons, caused no untoward effects. It was made by killing the cold viruses with the help of formaldehyde, much as is done when the Salk vaccine is made.

Readers should not apply to me for the vaccine because I understand it is still in the testing stage, and is not yet on the market.

Automobile Accidents

At a recent conference in New York City, the need was stressed for research as to the human factor in automobile accidents. As Dr. William B. Shepard, Chairman of the Council on Industrial Health of the American Medical Association, said, "As yet there is too little knowledge as to the characteristics of drivers. There is no question that some persons are highly prone to accidents while others never have an accident. We must make a greater study of the accident-prone people to learn why they are that way."

Dr. Herman E. Hilleboe, of New York, felt that physicians could be of great help in advising motor vehicle departments about the person who should not be driving. He felt that physicians should warn certain of their patients not to drive, especially when they are taking sedative drugs, or antihistaminics or large doses of insulin.

Such study by physicians should do good but, as usual, the persons who have most accidents will not listen to anyone. The Conference recommended that clinics be set up for the psychiatric study of drivers who have many accidents. This, of course, is logical, but of no value if the persons who are found to be mentally retarded, mildly insane, criminal, alcoholic, dangerously epileptic, or with poor control over their muscles can keep their license and can go on maiming one person after another. Nothing of any value will be done until the people of America decide that they want their judge to take the stupid, reckless, criminal or alcoholic drivers off our highways, and what is more important, keep them off.

Several Star Groups Have Dipper-Like Appearance

"I can see dippers all over the sky," a student once remarked in a surprised tone of voice. True enough. Many star groups have a dipper-like appearance though none is so well known as the famous Big Dipper of the north.

July and August are the best months for observing the beautiful southern constellation, Sagittarius the Archer, which contains two sky figures, the so-called Milk Dipper and the Teapot.

The Milk Dipper which derives its name from the fact that it lies in the Milky Way resembles the Little Dipper of the north. The Milk Dipper is always upside down and because its handle forms a sort of curving bow, the entire constellation is called Sagittarius which means "the Archer."

Outline Teapot

The five stars of the Milk Dipper together with the three stars that form a triangle slightly to the right or west of the Milk Dipper outline a perfect teapot. Ancient people, by including a few dim stars below the teapot and somewhat to the left or east of this sky figure imagined it to be a centaur with a drawn bow. The arrow seems to be pointed towards Antares, the heart of the Scorpion.

What is a centaur? The centaur was imaginary creatures with the body of a horse and the head, shoulders, torso, and arms of a man. They were always quarrelsome and delighted in wars.

Pauses to Rest

Hercules, returning from the accomplishment of one of his Twelve Labors, paused to rest at the home of the Centaurs, the Centaur, Pholus, whom Hercules had known in his youth, welcomed him royally and offered food, which was gratefully received.

"I am thirsty," said Hercules at the end of the meal. "I hope you have a cask of good wine."

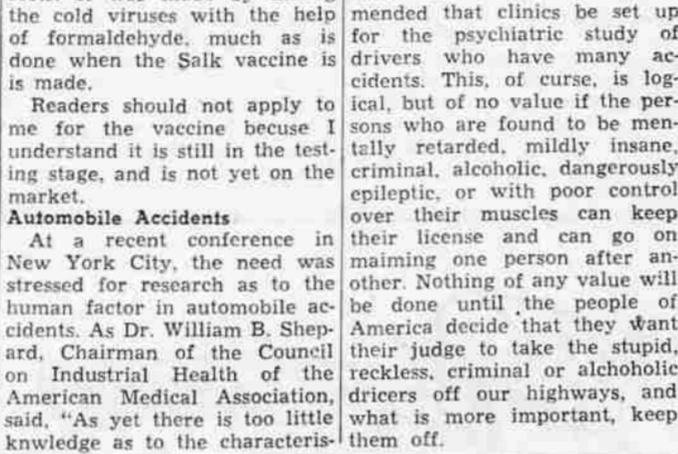
Pholus replied that he had a cask of wine but thought it best to leave it unopened. But Hercules insisted and finally the Centaur consented to open the cask.

As the fragrance of the liquor drifted out of the cave, all the Centaurs rushed in and dipped their drinking horns into the liquid in spite of efforts to replace the lid. Then they became like savages and wanted to fight their old friend and guest.

Shoots Arrow

Hercules, who was forced to defend himself shot an arrow at Elatus, most savage of the Centaurs, but at that moment, the Noble Centaur, Chiron, stepped out to settle the trouble and received the arrow in his breast.

Hercules tried to save the life of Chiron, but finding that to be impossible, prayed to Jupiter for help. In order to relieve the Noble Centaur of his pain, Jupiter took him to heaven and placed him in the sky as the constellation, Sagittarius, the Archer.

New Grand Jury Sworn at Eugene

Eugene — (U.P.) — Circuit Judge Dal M. King Friday discharged a Lane county grand jury whose selection had been challenged by District Attorney Eugene Venn and a new grand jury was immediately impaneled and sworn.

But Judge King emphasized his discharge order should not reflect on the competence of the members of the old jury.

Judge King said "I want to make it crystal clear that no member of this court feels that any member of this grand jury is unqualified to serve. No member of the grand jury has been accused of anything wrong."

The discharge order came on a motion by Elmer Sahlstrom, attorney for Lane County Circuit Judge Frank B. Reid. The motion was concurred in by Venn and by Oregon Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton who were both in the courtroom.

Venn had long demanded discharge of the grand jury, claiming that it had been improperly impaneled by Judge Reid, Sahlstrom, speaking for Judge Reid, told the court today that "in view of the controversy that has been aroused, and since justice delayed is justice denied, it was decided to ask for discharge of the grand jury."
