

Five Killed in Yuba City Crash

Yuba City, Calif.—(U.P.)—Five persons were killed and a sixth critically injured Saturday when two autos smashed head-on and burst into flames on U.S. Highway 40A three miles south of Robbins, Calif.

The dead were identified by Sutter County Coroner B. W. Ullrey as:

Joseph Ralph Clayborn, 30, route 1, Drain, Ore., and Mrs. Clayborn.

Floyd Russell Swartz, 63, Mrs. Swartz, and Carolyn Lois Swartz, 21, all of San Rafael, Calif.

A young daughter of the Clayborns was taken unconscious to the Yolo General hospital in Woodland, Calif., where she was reported in critical condition.

All six occupants of the two cars were thrown to the pavement by the impact of the crash which occurred on a slight curve on the two-lane road.

The highway patrol was investigating to determine the cause of the crash, one of the worst in Sutter county history.

Twining Visits Red Air Force Academy

Moscow—(U.P.)—U.S. Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Nathan F. Twining visited the Soviet Air Force Academy Saturday and saw a half-dozen Russian copies of the U.S. B29 Superfortress.

The bombers, which the Russians call "PU4s," were parked on the academy air field for students to use.

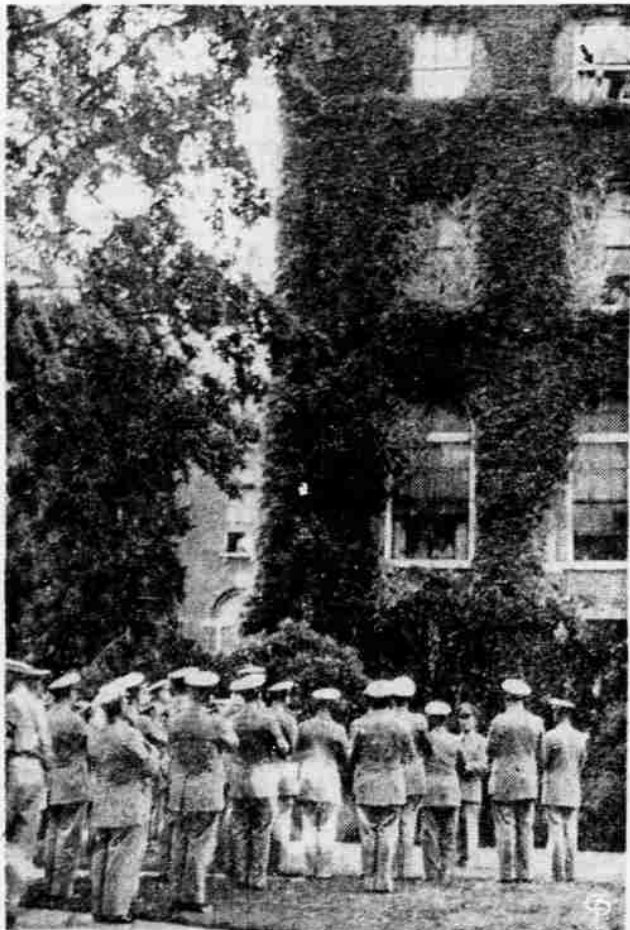
Twining, a former commander of the 20th Air Force that used B29s, told newsmen afterward:

"Nobody could tell the difference" between the U. S. and Russian versions.

Twining merely drove past the planes parked on the airfield. He did not look inside.

Twining spent the last day of his visit to Russia inspecting the Soviet Air Academy at Monino, 25 miles outside Moscow.

Ike In Gettysburg For Convalescence

Gettysburg, Pa.—(U.P.)—President Eisenhower, pale and weak but in high spirits after three weeks in the hospital, came to his quiet farm home Saturday for "at least" two weeks of convalescence and to weigh his second term plans.

The President, accompanied by Mrs. Eisenhower and two of his doctors made the 85-mile automobile drive from Walter Reed Army hospital in Washington in two hours and two minutes. The doctors said he showed natural fatigue but displayed no signs of undue strain.

While the doctors feel the operation actually increased Mr. Eisenhower's life expectancy it was bound to cause him to consider his political future once again. He went through a similar period of meditation early this year and decided his serious heart attack last Sept. 24 did not bar him from seeking reelection.

Mr. Eisenhower has said nothing about his political future since his operation. White House Press Secretary James C. Hagerty told accompanying reporters today that Mr. Eisenhower has not discussed the subject with him either.

Japanese Say U.S. Blew Plutonium Bomb

Tokyo—(U.P.)—Japanese scientists said Saturday they believed the United States exploded an uranium-wrapped plutonium bomb in the Eniwetok-Bikini atomic proving grounds this month.

The scholars recommended the government resume geiger-checking tuna from Pacific waters unloaded in Japanese ports because of the U.S. atomic test series in the Pacific last month and this month.

The scientists returned from a 35-day voyage through the Pacific checking the effects of the U.S. test on the ocean, marine life and the atmosphere.

Their report found that in general, the radio-active effects of the U.S. explosions were weaker than two years ago when the Americans carried out a similar series of tests.

Claims Ike Won't Impound AF Money

Washington—(U.P.)—The Senate's top GOP military expert predicted Saturday that President Eisenhower will not impound the extra \$900 million congress voted the Air Force.

Sen. Leverett Saltonstall (R-Mass.) told reporters he is confident the Air Force will be permitted to use the money. He is the ranking Republican member of the Senate Armed Service committee and the defense appropriations and air power subcommittees.

Some Democrats fear Mr. Eisenhower may impound the funds as former President Truman once did. Mr. Eisenhower may announce his decision when

he signs the \$34.6 billion defense appropriation approved by congress Friday.

Strong Winds Hamper Forest Fire Fighting

Santa Barbara—(U.P.)—Strong winds hampered efforts of 400 firefighters to control a five-day blaze which has blackened nearly 3500 acres in the Los Padres National forest.

The U.S. forestry service said it had hoped to control the fire early yesterday afternoon but high winds came up. Spokesmen said the blaze, which has destroyed mostly brush and some woodland oak, was "corralled" but not yet completely controlled.

Dublin's 1st Jewish Mayor Starts Battle on Housing

Dublin, Ireland—(U.P.)—Dublin's first Jewish mayor, who fought the British hold on Ireland and Palestine alike, has embarked on his "biggest battle."

"Housing," said Lord Mayor Robert Briscoe. "My biggest battle now is housing for my native city. We are still a good way behind our target and the population is growing."

Bob Briscoe declared his new "war" while they still were toasting his election in Ireland's 1,200 Jewish households. And in plenty of Christian households, too. They like Bob Briscoe here. He fights.

Like the time he staged a commando raid on the Irish consulate in New York and held it

for a week before some Irish policeman successfully counter-attacked.

Put Up Good Fight

"We put up a good fight," the 61-year-old Lord mayor recalled happily. "The police were led by a lieutenant named Goehgan. I wonder if he's still alive and recalls the event."

Nobody in Ireland could recall that a Jew ever before held the job of lord mayor in Dublin's 1,000-year history. Briscoe made it when his name was drawn from a hat to settle a tie vote between him and outgoing Mayor Denis Larkin in the City Council.

Briscoe, the Jewish Dublin youth who came home from a good business position in New Jersey when he was 22 to help

fight for Irish independence, is now first citizen of a city in whose streets he fought to overthrow English rule.

Sided With De Valera

When the full-scale civil war began, Briscoe sided with Eamon De Valera, grand old man of Irish politics and a New York born Irishman. During the revolutionaries' quarrel among themselves, De Valera ordered

Briscoe back to New York. He made headlines for himself—and the cause—by staging a raid on the offices of the Irish consulate on behalf of the De Valera forces. Briscoe said the consul backed the other side of the Irish cause. It took a squad of New York police to oust him from the building, but not until he held it a week.
