The Medical Roundup

Distressed mothers write asking what to do with a boy who is constantly borrowing his sister's clothes and putting them on. When he gets caught at it, he says he won't do it again, but he does not keep his promise. Such a boy obviously is what is called a transvestite, or a person with the personality of a woman and the body of a man. Often, if a physician will treat such a person with sympathy and understanding, he will learn that since childhood the fellow has wanted one thing, and that is to be a woman. Naturally then he wishes he could be operated on so as to become more like a woman. Every so often one reads in the newspapers of one of these persons, who, in Europe, did get operated on, and did assume the name and status of a woman.

An excellent book, describing the problems of such a person was written recently by someone who, for the first time in his life, was known as Robert Cowell. He was an aviator and a racing-car driver, but he was always rather feminine in appearance; and in restaurants people stared at him and wondered if perhaps he was a woman dressed in man's clothing. Yet he married and had children.

Eventually, he got operated on and officially became a woman, named Roberta Cowell. She wrote a most informative book called "Roberta Cowell's Story." A while ago she wrote me to say that she now feels greatly relieved to have made the change; at last she has achieved mental peace.

Parents need not worry about a transvestite as much as they might worry about a homosexual boy. Transvestites are rarely aggressive, and are not likely to bother other boys or men. Fortunately, women homosexuals are not bothered by the police or blackmailed as the men are.

I doubt if psychiatric treatment of these persons can do much good. I often say, a psychiatrist might just as well try to talk a normal heterosexual man into being a woman, or a normal heterosexual woman into being a man. He couldn't do it. The person not only could not change, but would not want to.

It is very unfortunate that most people in this world look upon these unhappy and unfortunate mixed-up people with dislike and even hatred, and have a desire to persecute them or jail them. Actually, but for the grace of God, any one of us might be in the same boat.

These poor people have been terribly gyped by Nature, which played a dirty trick on them. We are sorry for a man born without testicles or a penis, or a woman born without a vagina. Why, then, are we not equally sympathetic with these unfortunate men and women who were born with one type of mind and another type of body? We find the same peculiarities of sex in animals, and today scientists know much about the mechanisms that produce these sexual mix-ups.

All Grades of Sexuality

People should remember that, besides the mix-ups, there are all grades of sexuality in both men and women. Many partial homosexuals are able to marry and have children. They get by. Others are so decidedly homosexual that they cannot stand marriage. Some try it but soon have to give it up. Usually it is a cruel and a wrong thing for a strongly homosexual person to marry. Sometimes we doctors advise the person to marry, but in doing this we often do harm. I have talked to many a wife who went to pieces nervously when she discovered why her husband was so cold toward her, and why he spent so many of his evenings away from home with some man.

Men write to ask if there is any medicine they can take to make them normal sexually. I know of none. I am sure the trouble is rarely due to any abnormality in the glands of internal secretion. I remember a case in which for months physicians stuffed a homosexual man with male hormone without changing him a bit. Some homosexual men ask if there is any operation they can have performed that will make them normally heterosexual, but I know of none. The main trouble with

Merlin Youth Pleads Guilty to Murder

Grants Pass—(U.P.)—Lloyd Eugene Wahl, 18-year-old youth from Merlin, yesterday pleaded guilty to a murder charge in the rape slaying of his six-year-old cousin, Kathleen Sue Wahl, earlier this year.

Judge Orval J. Millard ordered Wahl committed to the state hospital in Salem for psychiatric examination, the result of which will be reported in 60 days.

Under Oregon law, passed by the last legislative session, a presentence public hearing will be held at the end of the 60 day period.

Wahl faces a sentence up to life imprisonment.

Body of Missing Man Found in Wrecked Car

Home Show Event Difficulties Told

Bill Dawkins told the chamber of commerce roundtable yesterday of the difficulties encountered in promoting the do-it-yourself home show held at the Blue Moon ranch near Central Point two weeks ago.

Dawkins said that the biggest hurdle faced in promoting the home show was organizing it in the short amount of time they had. It was planned and executed in a three week period, he said.

There were no major criticisms of the show, Dawkins said. He said that some merchants complained that they did not have enough time to prepare adequately, but the same merchants have already asked for more space for next year's show.

Next year, he said, it is hoped to hold it in the new armory. Dawkins said that about 12,000 people attended, which is about four times more than attended Roseburg's showing, an established yearly program.

He said about 60 booths were erected in the building and about 42 merchants contributed to the exhibitions.

Slayer of Three Killed by Police

Warren, O.—(U.P.)—The 11-day manhunt for triple slayer Alfred (Buck) Wilson, who swore, "You'll never take me alive again," ended suddenly Monday when bullets from two Ohio highway patrolmen fatally wounded the killer of two women and a young girl.

Wilson, 37, of nearby Leavittsburg, was cornered by three patrolmen after he successfully eluded capture in eight man-hunts during 12 days of freedom after killing his two sisters-in-law and a 16-year-old girl.

The fatal shots were fired by Russel M. Duffy Jr., 28, who spotted Wilson hiding in a tree. Duffy said he fired, "when Wilson raised his Luger and it was either him or maybe myself and Smith. Duffy referred to Patrolman Floyd Smith, his partner, who was circling in front of the trapped killer.

Duffy fired four shots. One tore through the back of Wilson's skull and a second traveled upward through the killer's jaw and lodged in his brain.

After Duffy's shots struck Wilson, the killer fell 20 feet, landing face-down. The accurate shooting prevented Wilson from using the four slugs in his Luger which landed three feet away.

Wilson was shot at 2 p.m. (EDT). He was pronounced dead four hours later at St. Joseph's hospital in Warren by Dr. William J. Ross. The killer never regained consciousness.
