Ashland—After three days of tryouts, two of the most sought-after roles in this season's Oregon Shakespearean festival went to two festival newcomers, Rosalyn Newport and Ted van Griethuysen.

Miss Newport, winner of the cherished role of Juliet, is from Wichita, Kansas, and is a student in the drama department at the Carnegie Institute of Technology in Pittsburgh, Penn.

In addition to her work at Carnegie Tech, Miss Newport has played many leading roles at the University of Wichita, including Desdemona in scenes from "Othello." She has also done considerable work in radio in Wichita.

This summer Miss Newport will play the role of Maria in "Love's Labour's Lost," in addition to the role of Juliet.

Ted van Griethuysen's home is Houston, Texas, and he is at present working toward a bachelor of fine arts degree in costume, at the University of Texas. This summer he has made his own Romeo costume, and has helped the costume department on several other costumes.

At the University of Texas, van Griethuysen played the title role in "Hamlet," directed by B. Iden Payne, who is currently directing this season's festival production of "Cymbeline." This past year, he danced the title role in a five act dance drama, "Doktor Faust."

Last summer he appeared at the Old Globe in San Diego, playing Laertes in "Hamlet."

In addition to Romeo, van Griethuysen is playing several other leading roles, including Clarence in "Richard the Third," Guiderius in "Cymbeline," and the King of Navarre in "Love's Labour's Lost."

All residents of the Talent area are invited to visit the library at those times and make selections of books and magazines from the many available, she said. The new hours are already in effect.

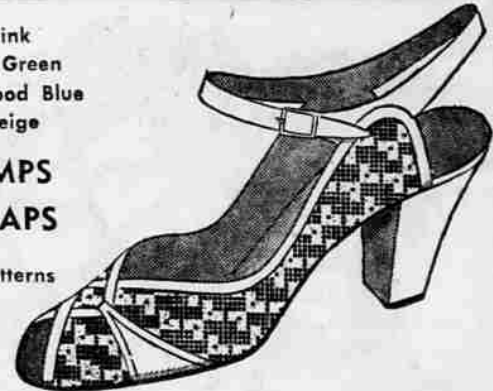
