 Oral auction bids will be received by the Regional Forester, or his authorized representative, in Room 210, Post Office Building, Medford, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 p.m., August 6, 1956, for all merchantable timber marked or designated for cutting on areas embracing about 240 acres located in a general sale area of 640 acres, more or less, within Sections 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, & 10, T. 30 S., R. 4 E., W.M., in the Crater National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 11,100 M board feet of Douglas-fir, 1,300 M board feet of Shasta red fir, 200 M board feet of incense cedar, 1,000 M board feet of ponderosa pine, sugar pine, & white pine, and 4,700 M board feet of white fir and other species of timber. No bid of less than \$27.55 per M board feet for Douglas-fir, \$10.25 per M board feet for Shasta red fir, \$3.45 per M board feet for incense cedar, \$46.50 per M board feet for ponderosa pine, sugar pine, & white pine, and \$4.75 per M board feet for white fir and other species will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.15 per M board feet, to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$0.50 per M board feet, to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the contract, will be required. As a qualification for oral bidding, all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the Forest Supervisor prior to 2:00 p.m., August 6, 1956. Sealed bids will be posted at the beginning of the auction for the information of all bidders.
