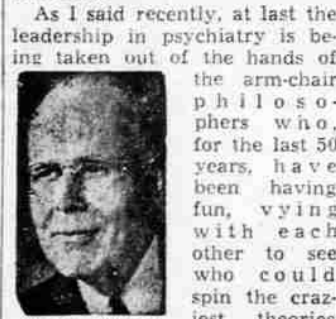

The Medical Roundup

Hope For Mentally Disturbed



As I said recently, at last the leadership in psychiatry is being taken out of the hands of the arm-chair philosophers who, for the last 50 years, have been having fun, vying with each other to see who could spin the craziest theories about the sexual and infantile origin of the psychoses. Today, people are beginning to laugh at these theories and to crack jokes about them. One hears of the psychiatrist who, meeting another, said, "You're fine; how am I?" Or, one hears of the psychiatrist who, meeting another, said casually, "How are you?" The man greeted turned to his wife, puzzled, apprehensive and hostile, and said, "I wonder what he meant by that?"

But, joking aside, as I said recently, a new type of psychiatry has arisen, fostered by laboratory research men, physiologists and chemists, physicists, brain surgeons and neurologists, all of them real scientists who have little patience with the many theories and squabbles of the analytic school. They are now using the methods of science to get definite answers to the question, "How does the brain work in health and disease?"

At last there should be a sharp distinction drawn between non-scientific theorizers and really scientific research workers. At last psychiatry should take its place again as a branch of scientific medicine, closely integrated with the other branches. At last many psychiatrists can again take an honored seat in scientific assemblies. At last some psychiatric journals may stop publishing almost unintelligible gobbledegook, and will again publish good articles in clear-cut, intelligible English.

Contains Indole Derivatives

As an example of what is now being done, several groups of scientists have shown that the urine of persons with schizophrenia—the commonest form of psychosis—contains amounts much larger than normal of certain indole derivatives. This suggests that these mentally ill persons have some poison in their body which is injuring their brain. Already it has been found that by giving to schizophrenics a diet lacking certain

"building blocks" that contain indole, the amount of this substance in the urine can be reduced to normal. Unfortunately, as yet, the patients so treated have not been made better, but a way has been opened up into the field, and this is what is hopeful.

At last, the thousands of persons in this country who have wealth, and perhaps because of some nervous disease in their family would like to give money for research in psychiatry, can now safely give it. Such money well expended may some day solve some of the problems involved in eradicating the commonest and most distressing of all diseases—psychosis.

Dr. Alvarez hopes his readers will understand that it would be impossible for him to answer requests for information or to attempt to diagnose by mail.

Authorities Close 180 Shops in Algiers

Algiers — (U.P.) — French authorities closed 180 shops indefinitely Saturday for complying with the general strike called Thursday by nationalist rebels.

A fifth of the closed establishments are owned by Europeans. The government warned shop-owners before the strike that their places of business would be closed for one month if they met the demands of the rebels to remain closed Thursday. But many defied the government ultimatum in fear of reprisals from cutthroat Moslem extremists.

Jada Ruled Winner Of Tahiti Yacht Race

Papeete Harbor, Tahiti — (U.P.) — The 56-foot yawl Jada, smallest of five boats, was ruled the winner today of the world's longest yacht race from Los Angeles Harbor to Tahiti.

Skipper Bill Sturgis' Jada of San Marino, Calif., was the second entry to reach here but her two-day handicap gave her the win over John P. Scripps' Novia del Mar. The 89-foot Novia sailed into this tiny harbor at 11:01.8 a.m. Saturday.

The Jada finished the race less than three hours later at 1:47.04. The Quest, 64-foot yawl owned by Dr. Howard F. Murphy, Beverly Hills, Calif., was the third boat to cross the finish line. Murphy's boat took second place because of a 40-hour handicap rating.
