Is Aspirin Dangerous?

Quite a few sufferers from headaches and joint pains keep asking if aspirin taken often, either alone or in one of the several patent mixtures with Phenacetin, an alkali, or other substances, will injure the heart or any other organ of the body. My impression is that aspirin is pretty safe. In the last few years some physicians have been prescribing it in large doses in cases of arthritis, and the patients are able to take it. I cannot remember ever having seen a case in which the drug had seemed to have done harm. There are occasional persons who seem to be so allergic to aspirin that, right after taking a tablet, their face will swell up and perhaps their skin will break out. Such persons, when they need a "pain-killer" have to rely on one of the other common headache-relievers, such as Phenacetin, Antipyrine, Pyramidon, or Acetaminol. Pyramidon should be taken with care because some persons are highly sensitive to it.

Jersey Cow Sets New Record in Production

W. D. Mongold, owner of La Pine Jersey Farm, route 1, Eagle Point, is owner of a registered Jersey cow that recently completed a 295-day herd improvement registry production record of 11,419 lbs. of milk containing 626 lbs. of butterfat at the age of 11 years, 11 months.

The official record was made by La Pine Sybil Mistress and her tests were supervised by Oregon State college for the American Jersey Cattle Club, Jersey breed registry organization at Columbus, Ohio.

Oregon Campus Area To Stay Dry

Portland — (U.P.) — The Oregon State Liquor Control Commission today moved to stamp out a rumor that it planned to relax its policy of maintaining a "dry zone" around the University of Oregon campus in Eugene.

The commission informed John W. Pennington, Eugene city attorney, that it had no intention of changing its attitude toward licensing establishments around the campus.

The policy has been to deny any application for a license from business establishments in the area unless they have the approval of the Eugene city council.

The "dry zone" has been in effect for the past five years through an agreement between the city of Eugene and the liquor commission. Under the arrangement, no licenses have been issued in a certain prescribed area surrounding the university campus and its residence units.

The city of Eugene had sent Pennington to determine the commission's attitude on the subject after rumors had cropped up that they were considering licensing an establishment in the dry zone.

Shrine To Install Imperial Potentate

Detroit — (U.P.) — A man from the world's smallest temple will be installed today as the Shrine's highest officer.

Gerald Crary, 64, Naja Temple, Deadwood, S.D., will be installed as imperial potentate today. He succeeds Walter C. Guy, Little Rock, Ark., to the highest position in Shrineism.

Crary, who joined the Shriners 42 years ago, served in many high shrine posts before being elected to the Imperial Outer Guard in 1947. He kept rising from there until today as imperial potentate he reached the top spot in the organization and became the leader of 775,000 Shriners in North America.

Crary and Guy, Scimitar Temple, were among the top Shriners officials who stood in the reviewing stand at Briggs Stadium, the home of the Detroit Tigers, Tuesday, to receive homage from the nobles who passed in review in a gigantic four-hour parade.
