## The Medical Roundup

### Ruptured Small Blood Vessels

Many persons ask me what to do about a black and blue mark which appears on the body, apparently without any preliminary injury or bump. I cannot say because I don't know what the cause is in the particular individual. Even if I could examine the person carefully I might not know. If I could examine, I would check first to make sure that the blood was normal and that there was no blood disease, such as could produce small hemorrhages. I would ask the person if he or she had ever had a tendency to bleed badly after a cut or after the removal of a tooth. I might want to know if the person was living on some crazy diet with

out fruit juices, salads, or fruits. I would ask this because a lack of vitamin C tends to make the blood vessels more friable. In many of these cases it may well be that the small blood vessels of the body can rupture easily. Just why they do is not always clear. One might check the blood pressure to see if it is very high. Rarely, in cases of very high blood pressure, there are little hemorrhages in various parts of the body. All of us have seen the persons who wake with a blood-shot eye. I remember a physician friend who had the worst hemorrhages all over under his skin that I have ever seen. After several years of this, he had a mouthful of bad teeth cleaned out, and after this, he had no more big black-and-blue spots.
