Portland, Ore. — (AP) — An earth tremor recorded on a Portland seismograph as a "very light local" earthquake shook a limited area around Eugene and Springfield at 5:58 a.m. Saturday.

William Geitz, Portland seismologist, said the tremor appeared on his charts for about five-and-a-half minutes. Residents in an area from the Cal Young road to Gamebird village around Eugene called radio stations, newspapers and police saying they had felt the tremor.
