The Medical Roundup

Disease Keeps Lurking For Us

I am always saddened when I hear people expressing hostility against the able health authorities to whom, each day, they owe their health and very life, and the health and lives of their loved ones. Even college graduates sometimes seem to think that the tremendous improvement in public health, with the almost complete banishment of formerly common and often fatal diseases, such as smallpox, diphtheria, typhoid fever, dysentery, cholera, pneumonia and mastoiditis, has come about automatically. Recently a lawyer said to me angrily, "You have your nerve, ascribing all these improvements in our health to medical research, boards of health, bacteriologists, physicians and others; why not give the credit to better food, better housing and advancing civilizations?"



How I wished that that lawyer could have lived for a while around a place like the Hooper Foundation, in San Francisco, a research department of the University of California, presided over for years by my old friend, Dr. Karl F. Meyer. Because he is a great expert on bacteriology and epidemiology, until he retired, every time there appeared in California a very dangerous epidemic of some usually fatal disease, he was quickly consulted by the anxious health officers. Often he would go to the affected locality to help the field workers to find the source of the infection, and to nip the epidemic in the bud. People had no knowledge.

Usually, in order to avoid scaring people and throwing them into a panic, no mention of the emergency was made in the papers; and hence, when the epidemic was over and the great danger averted, the people of the state had no knowledge of what had happened. What was unfortunate about this was that

hundreds of thousands of good people, like the lawyer who scolded me, had never even heard of the fine and devoted men and women who had worked day and night to stamp out an epidemic, perhaps of bubonic plague—the "Black Death" that killed millions of people in Europe during the Middle Ages.

Even I do not know the names of the bacteriologists who, every day in my city, see to it that the water I drink is free from dangerous germs. I ought to know their names, if only that I might thank them occasionally for their vigilance. I owe them so much—perhaps even my life. Those of you readers who doubt this should go traveling in some foreign land that is not kept clean, and see how quickly you come down with dysentery.

Because our people in the United States live in such a blissful and ignorant state of security, hundreds of thousands of men and women even doubt if the many germs and viruses, rickettsias and spirochetes produce the many infectious diseases that still affect us. They speak of "the germ theory of disease" as if it still were a theory. Because of our lack of knowledge of infectious disease, when the highly-trained and expert health authorities of a great city warn us that a dangerous epidemic has started, and that we must take certain simple and harmless precautions, often hundreds of thousands of us rise up to block the ordinance. We refuse to take the advice of the men whom we pay to tell us how to stay well.

It is sad that instead of being able to nip an epidemic in the bud, the health authorities are often compelled to wait and do little until, with the coming of

perhaps scores of fatal cases, public opinion is aroused sufficiently so that the protective ordinance can be enforced. To illustrate: When hydrophobia begins to become epidemic in a city, the health officer would like to wipe the disease right out by vaccinating and protecting all dogs, but he cannot do this because so many of the dog owners, who, if they knew anything about medicine, would be the first to protect their pets from sure death, fight the ordinance with every means at their command. Aren't we humans funny!

In August, a year ago, many people in a small district in California began to come down with a severe type of malaria. Where had it come from? There hadn't been any malaria in that region since 1945 when health authorities had wiped it out. What happened was that a few mosquitoes remained, and these got infested with malaria by biting a soldier who had returned from

perhaps by the million were dying of the plague, no one knew what to do to stop it. About all the authorities did was to build bonfires in the streets. Today, because we know that the plague is due to a germ that lives in rats and is transmitted to man by fleas, all we have to do to stop a terrible epidemic in, let us say, India is to kill rats and fleas. Years ago, the Plague Commission showed that if guinea pigs were left in cages on the floor of a house in which

German Ambassador Recalled by Reds

Bonn, Germany—(U.P.)—Russia's ambassador to West Germany, Valerian Zorin, has been suddenly recalled by the Soviet's and transferred to another post, the Bonn government has announced.

A spokesman for Chancellor Konrad Adenauer said Zorin called unexpectedly on West German Foreign Minister Heinrich Von Brentano "to pay his farewell visit."

The Soviet envoy told Brentano he had been transferred to another post, the German spokesman said. Zorin said he would leave Bonn within a few days.

Chef, Marine Captain Fail in Quiz Contest

New York—(U.P.)—A hotel chef and Marine Capt. Richard S. McCutchen tied Sunday night on the \$64,000 Challenge when each got stuck in a 16,000 question on pastry.

Joseph Amblard, executive chef of the Commodore Hotel in New York, will attempt to settle the deadlock next Sunday.

Amblard failed first in his attempt to identify five kinds of pastry, the name of the country in which it originated and its distinctive filling.

They were vatrushki, a Russian pastry filled with sweetened pot cheese or cottage cheese; kaaga temer, a syrian pastry filled with ground or mashed dates; debosh torte, a Hungarian pastry filled with chocolate butter cream; Cassatini, an Italian pastry filled with Ricotta cheese; and lemon curd tart, an English pastry filled with a mixture of lemon juice, butter, eggs and sugar.

McCutchen failed to identify the kaaga temer.

Crash Kills Four On Swiss Airliner

Shannon, Ireland—(U.P.)—A Swiss Airlines Conair passenger plane en route from California to Switzerland crashed Sunday while making a routine landing at Shannon Airport, killing all four members of its crew.

The twin-engine plane carried no passengers.

The victims were identified as pilot Stanford Whitley, copilot H. Ross Peacock and flight engineer Fred E. Mahon, all of San Diego, and Swiss navigator Jacob Wisemer.

The plane was being ferried from San Diego to Zurich when it nosed into a Shannon estuary sandbank.

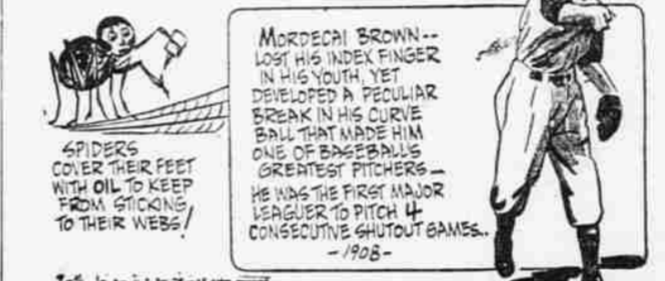
