### AN OPERATION FOR SOME DEAF PERSONS

Word comes from Montreal that in a recent panel discussion, Dr. Samuel Rosen, of New York City reported 1,091 operations for mobilization of the stapes of the inner ear in the middle ear which looks like the stirrup on a saddle. The bottom part of this stirrup bone fits into a little hole in the bony wall of the middle ear. Normally it transmits sound from the eardrum to the perceptive mechanism in the internal ear. The deafness of some persons is due to the fact that the little stirrup has become so firmly fastened in the opening that it cannot move much. Then, if an ear surgeon can operate and loosen it up or mobilize it he may take the person back most of his hearing. According to the panel the operation worked well in 35 per cent of the cases and there was considerable improvement in 46 per cent.

### BLINDNESS OF THE NEW-BORN

I see in a report by Dr. Alfred Yankner, Dr. Harold Jacobson, and David M. Schneider, Ph. D. of New York State, the incidence of infant blindness caused by retrolental fibroplasia dropped 83 per cent in the last year in their state. This is since hospitals stopped putting prematurely-born babies into an atmosphere rich in oxygen. Mrs. M. F.—I want to correct a 15-year-old misunderstanding. M. F.—It's ancient history. She should stop brooding.

Mrs. M. F.—I wonder whether it is possible to straighten out a 15-year-old misunderstanding. Many years ago, before I was married, my father told our closest family friend some very personal and derogatory things about a young man I had been dating. My father objected to this young man strenuously and I later came to dislike him for reasons of my own. At the same time I was dating the man who shortly after became my husband.

The wife, on the other hand, should realize that "brooding" is excessively over the matter and attaching too much importance to this friend's opinion hurts her husband because there is a subtle implication that her regard for him could be somewhat affected by an outside opinion. These are the factors that have probably produced an emotional tangle in this case and the husband and wife would do well to further clarify their feelings to one another. This is the most important thing.

If afterwards, they both decide to enlighten the friend, a way could be found of doing it without embarrassing anybody. The wife might simply mention that the young man her father spoke of him about long ago has been living in Timbuktoo all these years or disappeared behind the Iron Curtain 10 years ago. It would seem only fair to give so close a friend an opportunity to relieve his mind of a false and unpleasant impression.

### Robed Klansmen Burn Cross in Florida

Lakeland, Fla.—Some 250 white robed, hooded Ku Klux Klansmen burned a fiery cross here Friday night before some 3,000 spectators, denouncing integration, the Supreme Court, Negroes, Jews, Catholics and Communists and promising a cheering audience that "our kind of white people will rule the world."

Meanwhile, just five miles away in a small unpainted frame church, some 150 Negroes prayed for "peace and harmony" and offered prayers "for our friends and the many organizations that know not God."

The hooded Klansmen, screaming in a wild fashion, called on the spectators to join the KKK in spirit, principles, and membership.

### Reds Admit Lagging In Atom Harnessing

New York (UPI)—Russia admitted to Americans Saturday that she is lagging behind in the race to harness atomic-power for transport.

The Russians said they have not yet been able to put the atom to work as a propelling force but are building a nuclear-powered ice breaker that will need to be refueled only once every two or three years.

They made no mention of the fact that the U.S. has an atom-powered submarine that has traveled more than 50,000 miles without refueling and is building two more nuclear subs.

The state of the Soviet Union's atomic developments was discussed in "USSR," the new Russian English-language propaganda magazine that will go on sale throughout the U.S. next week. "Amerika," a U.S. government magazine, will be circulated in Russia at the same time.

### Soviets Not Planning To Help Build Dam

Moscow (UPI)—Foreign Minister Dmitri Shepilov said Saturday the Soviet Union does not have under consideration any proposal to help Egypt build the Aswan dam across the Nile river.

He said neither he nor any other Soviet leaders are working on "problems connected with the Aswan dam."

### Crooked River Project Scheduled for House

Washington (UPI)—Oregon Senators Wayne Morse and Richard Neuberger announced here Saturday that they have been assured their bill for the Crooked river irrigation project will come up for action in the House before congress adjourns this summer.

The bill already has Senate approval.

The two senators said that a conference with House Speaker Sam Rayburn had resulted in their assurance the bill will come during this session of congress.

### Standards Announced For Road Program

Washington (UPI)—The government Saturday announced construction standards for the 41,000-mile national network of superhighways to be built under the recently approved \$32.4 billion program.

The standards, approved by the U.S. bureau of public roads and the American Association of state highway officials, are basically similar to those used in some of the existing super highways.
