Bandleader Arrested For Drunken Driving

Beverly Hills, Calif.—UP—Bandleader Freddie Martin, 48, was free on \$200 bail today after being arrested on drunk driving charges on Wilshire Blvd. Martin told officers when he was arrested early Monday that he had "one or two" drinks after finishing an engagement at a hotel here. He was ordered to appear in Municipal Court for trial next week. The bandleader was convicted of drunk driving last October 28 and fined \$250.

Non-Agricultural Employment Jumps

Salem—UP—Non-agricultural employment in Oregon jumped 19,000 last month to a new high of 499,000, the state unemployment commission reported today. The total was 1900 above last September's former peak and 21,200 higher than June, 1955.

An early last month that boosted cannery employment to 13,600—nearly 6,000 more than a year ago—contributed greatly to the new record, the commission said.

Construction, service industries, transportation and utilities, metals and machinery and ship repairing all showed gains over 1955.

Logging and sawmills were the only industrial group reporting fewer workers than a year ago.

Pacific Nuclear Experiments Ended

Washington—UP—The government's 1956 series of mighty nuclear tests in the Pacific is completed.

A joint announcement by the Atomic Energy commission and the Defense department said on Monday the completed tests "contributed materially to the security of the United States and the Free World."

AEC Chairman Lewis L. Strauss and Defense Secretary Charles E. Wilson said the tests "advanced the development of weapons with reduced fallout and weapons for tactical purposes."

They said one of the "successful" results is further development of methods of defending against attack, presumably nuclear anti-aircraft weapons.

Guatemala Siege State Extended

Guatemala City—UP—The state of siege in Guatemala since June 25 was extended Monday for another 30 days.

The extension decree said the conditions which caused the state of siege, or modified martial law, to be imposed for one month still existed.

The state of siege was decreed originally after a demonstration which authorities said was Communist-inspired. An official announcement at that time said Communists intended to set off "a series of acts calculated to sow panic and disorder in the country, creating an atmosphere favorable to their subversive plans."

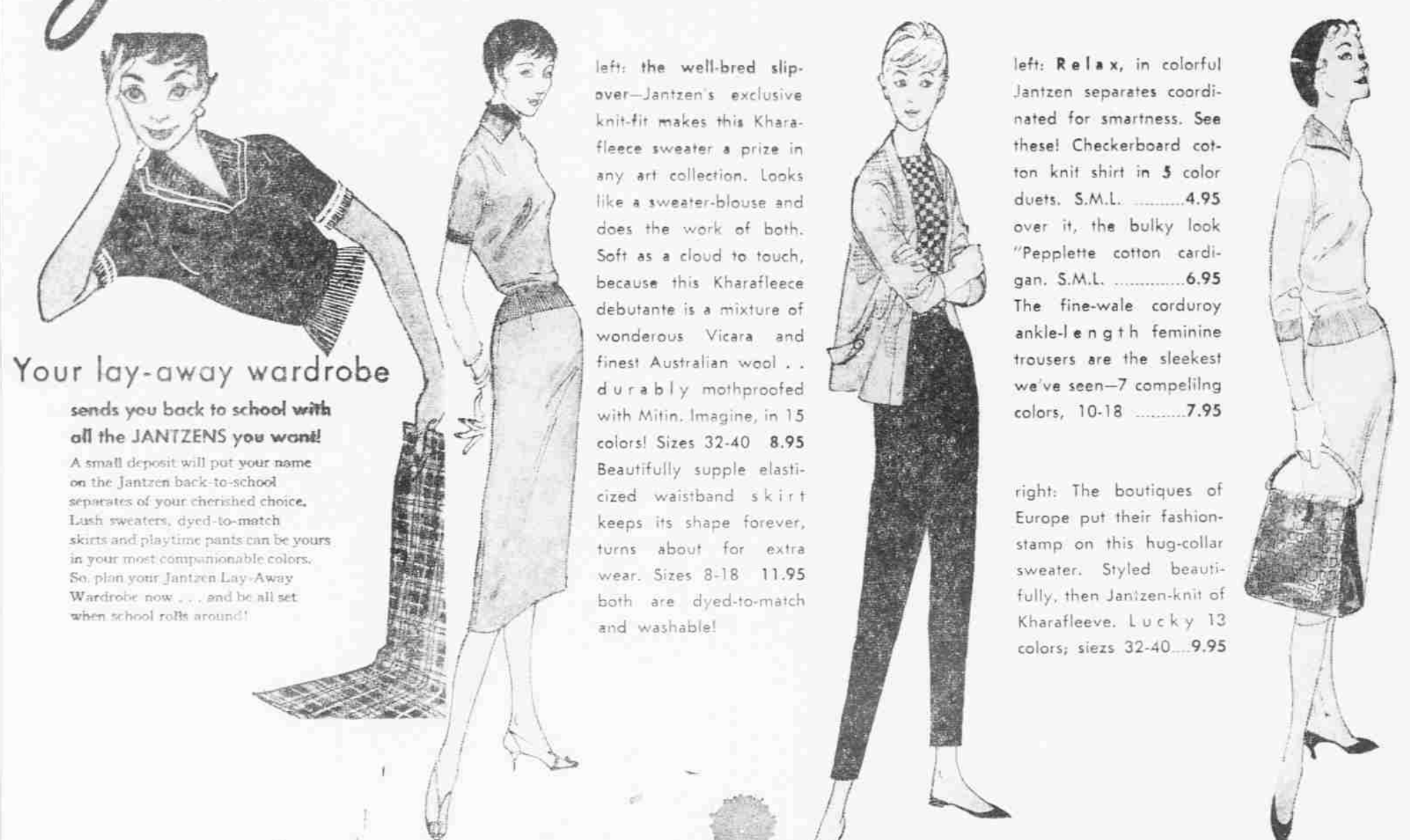
Cinerama Actor Drowns in Pakistan

Lahore, Pakistan—UP—Jim Parkes, the leading actor in a new Cinerama film, was drowned last Friday during a filming sequence, members of the movie crew reported Monday.

Parkes was the only member of the group who was not wearing a lifebelt when a rubber boat capsized in a swift river near Gilgit, his fellow workers said.

The crew was shooting close-ups for the Lowell Thomas Cinerama Productions film "Search for Shangri-La." Nearly all of the unit's 10 tons of equipment was also lost in the accident.
