

Fate of Sightless Boy Known Soon

Orlando, Fla.—U.P.—Doctors expect to learn within a week or two whether cancer which already has cost Mike Sibole two eyes still threatens his life.

The Rev. James W. Sibole said he consulted with physicians Wednesday when they fitted out his four-year-old son with a second plastic eye in place of the eye removed a week ago.

The other eye was removed two years ago but cancer of the retina spread to the second eye. Doctors said it had to be removed, too, to save Mike's life.

Further Checks Due

Mike will be given further checks to see whether the operation which plunged the boy into permanent blindness has prevented the cancer from spreading to other parts of his body.

"We can only pray that it won't," the Rev. Sibole said. "Mike has made a marvelous adjustment. We just can't believe our own eyes. It's surprising how he gets around and how he has such enthusiasm."

Sibole proudly described Mike's braver, in the ordeal of having the plastic eye inserted in the swollen socket. He chinked his little hands but did not whimper.

"He seemed so pleased that he has two eyes again, and he's glad to get the bandages off," Sibole said.

'Phelan's Flag' Urged As National Flower

Memphis, Tenn.—U.P.—Stephen Phelan thinks it would be a "natural" if the lawmakers picked his red, white and blue rose as the national flower. Such legislation was introduced in Congress.

"Could you find anything more appropriate?" he said. "Phelan put flower-lovers in a tizzy when he came up with his red, white and blue 'Phelan's Flag' a few years ago. The blue, a color horticulturists had sought for centuries to develop in roses, was so true the government gave him a patent on the flower."

Now Phelan has come up with the red, white and blue tree rose. At first, Phelan was worried that his rose would not prove adaptable to different areas of the country. But tests from California to the east coast indicate the rose makes itself at home in almost any soil or climate.

The root system also proved itself remarkably adaptable. Phelan said. Not only does it grow as a regular rose bush and as a tree rose, but also as a potted plant.

Experiences Assist Mentally Retarded

Vermillion, S. D.—U.P.—An important part of learning for the mentally limited child is in having direct experiences with the world around him.

This is a theory of Dr. H. V. Cobb, psychology head and director of special education at the University of South Dakota with the approved summer school being offered to mentally retarded children this year.

Dr. Cobb says these enriching experiences can best be provided by a series of trips and excursions. Also, a program of carefully planned adaptive physical education gives the children healthful exercise and recreational activity.

The program by the university is only open to South Dakota students between the ages of eight and 13. The children receive regular instruction, and, in addition, have the advantage of several special facilities of the university.

Old Age Assistance Given Giant Redwood

Chicago—U.P.—"Old age assistance" in the form of a fog-maker is being given a 1,100-year-old redwood at Palo Alto, Calif., according to Forestry Director.

The prized 160-foot-tall tree is being watered by means of a sprinkler, water for which is piped to its top. The system is turned on twice a week during dry weather.

The sprinkler supplies a "foggy vapor," creating the ideal atmosphere for redwoods and cleaning city smoke and grit from the needles.

In trying to add on an additional 500 years of life to the ancient landmark, small amounts of iron and nitrogen are introduced into the fog.

The huge redwood is said to have suggested the name Palo Alto, which means "tall tree" in Spanish.

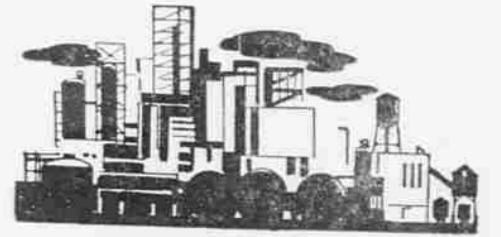
