Mobile Inoculation Unit in Chicago

Chicago—U.P.—An emergency mobile inoculation unit rolled through Chicago's polo-troughed West Side today, injecting free Salk polio shots in an attempt to throttle the city's polio epidemic.

The early season outbreak of the crippling disease, the worst this year in the nation, concentrated in a 25-square mile area spotted with slums west of the city's downtown section. Fifty-one per cent of this year's cases have been reported in the area.

To cope with an anticipated jump in the polio rate during August, Dr. Herman N. Budek, president of the city Board of Health, appealed for medical facilities to help administer polio vaccinations. Fifty-eight hospitals and clinics are now cooperating to carry out the mass inoculation program.

The total of reported cases in the city this year reached 422 with the addition of 63 new victims during a 72-hour period ending at midnight Sunday. The total includes 11 deaths since Jan. 1.

Steel Shares Lift Stock Market To New Record High

New York—U.P.—Steel shares lifted the stock market to a new record high in the composite average today.

Volume increased to the highest level, except for one session, since June 8, the day President Eisenhower took ill. Today's demand for steel shares sent most of them to new highs. Their strength reflected anticipation of resumption of steel operations in a day or two.

Capitol Planners Joined by Odell

Salem—U.P.—Dr. Morgan Odell, president of Lewis and Clark College at Portland, was named to a four-year term on the Capitol Planning Commission by Gov. Elmo Smith today.

Dr. Odell will succeed Robert W. Sawyer of Bend, veteran Oregon newspaperman, who has served as planning commission chairman since it was created in 1949. Sawyer asked to be relieved of his duties on advice of his doctor.

Gov. Smith accepted Sawyer's resignation with regret and praised him for "unselfish years of service to the state and his devotion to the cause of preserving the beauty and dignity of the capitol area."

At the same time, Gov. Smith reappointed Dean Sidney Little of the architecture and allied arts school of the University of Oregon to the commission. Other members are Charles A. Sprague, Salem publisher; George W. Gleason, dean of engineering at Oregon State College; Milton L. Leyers and Elizabeth Lord, Salem; and Herman Brockman, Portland.

Convicts Break Legs With Hammers

Bilford, Ga.—U.P.—Prison officials today attempted to learn why more than 30 "hardened" convicts broke their legs with sledge hammers in a demonstration against working conditions at the Rocky Quarry State Prison for incorrigibles here.

State Director of Corrections Jack Forrester said 36 prisoners, including seven Negroes, used ten-pound sledge hammers with rocks serving as anvils as they tried to break their legs in an attempt to escape from the hard work at the quarry.

A prison doctor said that all but "four or five" of the prisoners managed to fracture their legs, and at least ten of them suffered from compound breaks. The injured convicts were rushed by ambulances and a bus nearly 200 miles late Monday night to the Reidsville State Prison, which has better hospital facilities.

Forrester said all the prisoners involved in the bloody protest were maximum security inmates or incorrigibles. He said there was no trouble from the other convicts following the demonstration.

Ike Signs Bill on Fruits and Vegetables
Washington—U.P.—President Eisenhower has signed legislation to tighten up laws in the marketing of fresh fruits and vegetables.

The new law raises from \$15 to \$25 a year the maximum annual license fee for dealers, and broadens the ground for refusing to grant a license.

It also eliminates the necessity of proving "fraudulent purpose" in connection with misbranding any perishable farm commodity.
