

Andrea Doria May Have Veered Across Path Of Onrushing Stockholm, Reports Indicate

New York (AP)—A report of the Andrea Doria's collision with the Stockholm on the Atlantic coast today was the first indication that the two ships were on a collision course.

A spokesman for the Italian Line said the Stockholm was on a collision course with the Andrea Doria.

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The report was one of the first details to be learned of the collision on the Atlantic coast today.

Several hundred stranded passengers from the Stockholm waited today in hotels and at the homes of friends and relatives for alternate transportation to Europe.

The Swedish-American Line said only 15 of the liner's 535 passengers cancelled plans to go abroad and returned to their homes. They were American tourists who were committed to guided tours in Scandinavia and would have arrived too late to begin them.

Some 110 survivors of the Stockholm's ramming of the An-

dreia Doria last Wednesday night already have found space on Scandinavian Airline's planes leaving by the end of the week.

Thirty were able to fly to Europe last Friday shortly after they disembarked from the Stockholm. Scores of others have made bookings on various trans-Atlantic airlines.

Crews Double Up

A spokesman for the line said 165 Stockholm passengers will leave New York aboard the Bergensfjord Wednesday and 140 have been allotted space aboard the Kingsholm sailing Friday. Accommodations of extra passengers was made possible by the crews of both ships who volunteered to double up so crew quarters could be used for the survivors.

Bookings on the ships of other lines were so heavy that few passengers from the Stockholm were able to find space. Two lucky passengers were able to sail on the United States liner America within a few hours after the Stockholm's return here last Friday. One person found a berth on the Mauretania on Saturday.

Repair Work Begun

The line has provided \$50 for each adult passenger and \$25 for each child to tide them over until Friday. It kept its offices open all week end and has assigned representatives to the Governor Clinton hotel to take care of passengers needs and help them find transportation abroad.

The next big problem of Swedish-American Line authorities is to find alternate passage for passengers scheduled to return from Scandinavia on the Stockholm in August and September.

Repair work on the liner's obliterated prow already has begun at the Bethlehem Steel Co.'s dry dock in Brooklyn but no estimate of when the ship will be back in service has been made yet. It will probably be months, maritime experts said.

Stevenson Given Best Chance To Win Nomination

Washington—UP—Sen. Allen J. Ellender said today he thinks Adlai E. Stevenson "has the best chance" of winning the Democratic presidential nomination of one of the four announced candidates.

The Louisiana Democrat would not speculate, however, on whether the former Illinois governor can nail down the nomination on the first ballot, as some supporters of Stevenson have claimed.

Few Petition Signers

The United Press learned Monday that an "I Like Stevenson" petition was circulated among House Democrats last week but drew only about 300 names and then was dropped. Sponsors of the petition had hoped to get about 125 of the 231 House Democrats to sign it.

A spot check showed, however, that the petition apparently did not reach all Stevenson supporters in the House.

A Democrat active in the pro-Stevenson effort attributed the poor showing to the "many distractions" of the final week of Congress and to the fact that many Democrats come from states with their own favorite son candidates.

Among these states are Texas, Missouri, Massachusetts, Michigan, Ohio, Washington and New Mexico.

Ellender Dark Horses

Ellender told the United Press before leaving for a two-month trip abroad that while he thinks Stevenson is the front runner, he still likes three potential dark horses. If the convention should become deadlocked.

He cited Senate Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson (Tex.), Sen. Robert S. Kerr (Okla.) and Sen. Stuart Symington (Md.). Ellender said he thought Johnson would make an "especially strong" candidate because he is a "vigorous, forceful leader."

The victim was working as a truck loader at Sycan siding near Doon.

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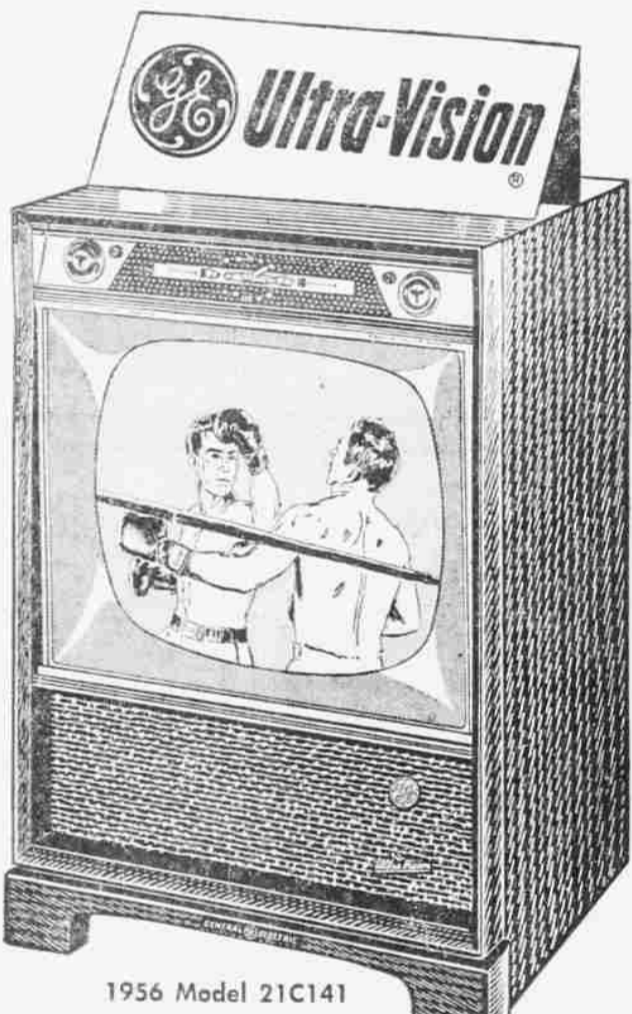
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
