Missouri Nursing Home Fire Kills 12

Puxico, Mo. — (U.P.) — Twelve persons, nine of them between the ages of 72 and 91, burned to death Monday night when fire swept a three-story frame nursing home here.

One patient, Mrs. Sherry Fredericks of Poplar Bluff, was rescued by a minister and a service station operator.

The dead included Tom Gard, 83, and Mrs. Paralee Dugger, 85, both of Fisk, Mo.; Mrs. Harriet Shaffer, 88, Malden, Mo.; James F. Stringfellow, 73, and Mrs. Rosa Allwood, 72, both of Chaffee, Mo.; Nancy A. Deason, 91, and Mrs. Mattie Mae Young, 76, both of Dexter, Mo., and B. O. Kinnemon, 76; and George Casey, 81, both of Puxico.

The other dead were elderly patients.
