A Dropped Bladder

Many women who have had children have had the floor of the pelvis so badly torn that the bladder rolls downward. In these cases the poor woman will have trouble emptying her bladder and her bowel. Because of stagnation of urine in her bladder she may get some inflammation (cystitis) in it. In such cases the surgeon can often help greatly by pushing the bladder up and repairing the pelvic floor. The big problem is to find enough of the ends of the torn muscle out on each side, and then to bring these ends together and to unite them with strong sutures.

A merry lady writes that she was so impressed by an article of mine on low blood pressure, in which I said that persons who had it ought to get down on their knees and thank God for it, that she did just this. But she says it did not work so well because, what with her bad arthritis, she had a hard time getting back up again! But then, like the very wise woman she must be, she did not spend any time wallowing or complaining. As she says, she got a big chuckle out of the experience, and she so wanted to share it with me that she wrote the note. Blessings on her! When we smile or chuckle or laugh with someone we never know how much good we are doing, or how far the good will spread. The morning I received that letter I needed a lift because some annoyance had almost gotten me down. The letter made me chuckle, and after that it was a good day—with the annoyance forgotten. Perhaps now, as millions of people read this, many of them, too, will chuckle, and their sadness will, for a while, be forgotten.

Series of Thefts Cleared With Arrests

A series of thefts which have occurred in the county during the past few months was cleared up Wednesday as sheriff's deputies corroborated statements from four people recently arrested in Medford for larceny from a store.

Admitting responsibility for most of the thefts were Gilbert Wayne Cooper, 19, Trail, and his 16-year-old wife. The sheriff's office reported the thefts occurred in residences, cafes, stores, cars, a mill, a service station, school bus and a small bus.

Jack Joe Dugger, 19, Trail, assisted Cooper in stealing gas from a school bus and damaging the vehicle to the extent it would not start, deputies said.

The statements were obtained on July 25, after city police arrested Cooper, Dugger and their wives, ages 16 and 17, for larceny in a store. Deputies said Mrs. Dugger implicated the others in the sequence of thefts after admitting her part in the misdemeanor for which she was arrested.

Each was sentenced in district court to five months in the county jail for larceny in a store. Two have already been released on parole.

The district attorney's office said no further charges will be brought against the Coopers. Mrs. Cooper is expecting a child soon and Cooper has stated he intends to join the Army in the near future. Dugger's only apparent connection with the thefts, the sheriff's office pointed out, was gasoline theft and no charge will be filed against him.

Severe Hiccup

As everyone knows, brief spells of hiccup are common, and fortunately this recurrent spasm of the diaphragm or mid-ribs will usually stop within a few minutes if the person will sip water or eat a little food or will hold his breath as long as he can. My physician son cures hiccup by reaching up on a wall as far as he can, or by pressing his little fingers hard with thumb. I remember when I was 12 having a prolonged attack of hiccup which the sipping of water would not stop. Then my old Scottish nurse cured me by threatening to report to my mother some mischief I had been up to. This got me so worried that I promptly lost my hiccup. During the first world war a soldier who had had hiccups all day was cured when a shell burst near him. After that his buddies called the shells "Bill Smith's hiccup cure!"

Every so often one reads in the papers of someone who has been hiccupping for a couple of weeks or more. Naturally, such persons are utterly miserable. Usually they receive a hundred letters from people who tell how they cured themselves of hiccup. These persons do not realize that, in their case, the hiccup probably quit about the time they were taking something or other. In the worst cases of hiccup a nerve in the neck is cut. The breathing of carbon dioxide gas and oxygen may work a cure.

Senator Comments On GOP Statements

Washington (Special) — Senator Richard L. Neuberger charged today that leading Oregon Republicans were issuing declarations of primary expenditures filed with the elections bureau at Salem.

Neuberger cited a public statement by W. L. Phillips, manager of the McKay-for-senator campaign, that "the vast majority" of McKay campaign contributions "range from \$1 to \$10."

"Yet," Neuberger said, "the official and sworn statement of the McKay campaign committee for the recent Oregon primary campaign shows that over 70 per cent of the reported McKay contributions came from 23 large donors of sums from \$500 to \$3,000."

Neuberger declared that this must mean "either that Phillips deliberately tried to mislead the public concerning the nature and origin of the McKay financing, or that the official declaration of the McKay campaign committee, under our election laws, is inaccurate."

Neuberger added the comment that "whenever Oregon Republican leaders plead political poverty so touchingly, they will be reminded that their party's candidates spent \$194,000 in the recent primary, as contrasted with only \$65,000 for all Democratic candidates."

Standards Governing Communications Listed

Salem—The state wage and hour commission has notified telephone and telegraph companies that new standards governing employment of women and minors under 18 in communications work will go into effect Saturday, Aug. 4.

Labor Commissioner Norman O. Nilsen, executive secretary of the commission, said the new communications order advances the legal minimum wage from 35 cents to 75 cents an hour and requires payment of 1½ times the regular pay rate for emergency overtime.

He said a provision in previous communications standards permitting employment of learners at sub-minimum wages was not included since the commission purposed the new minimum to serve as a wage floor for inexperienced workers.
