### People Who Fight The Salk Vaccine

Recently, in Redgok, Florida Schreiber had a remarkable article on several groups of people in this country who have been fighting the use of the Salk vaccine. These attacks are completely unjustified because now that the few early mistakes in vaccine production have been rectified, there hasn't been a single case in which the vaccine has done harm. If ever a medicine was safe, the Salk vaccine is safe. It has also been shown to be effective—so effective that almost all of the die-hards among physicians have now given in.

Miss Schreiber points out the mental twists of most of the persons who have attacked Salk and his vaccine. Many have attacked the vaccine bitterly because Salk is a Jew—as if that would make any difference! Many of the greatest scientists in the world have been Jews, and the world is the richer for their magnificent work.

headline the statement, "The mass poisoning of American children."

I wish all my readers would learn, as I have learned, that when anyone fights a health measure with such violent language, there is something wrong with him, his brain, his sanity, and his sense of decency. I could not publish some of the letters I get from people who are fighting fluoridation of water, or animal experimentation. They are too obscene and too nasty to be printed.

It is interesting to read in Miss Schreiber's article that Koch and Hoxey, whose remedies for cancer are said by the government to be useless, are fighting the Salk vaccine. I have always noted that when a group starts fighting a health measure, one can find, joined with them, a lot of quacks, irregular practitioners, peddlers of supposed medicine, anti-vaccinationists, anti-vivisectionists, and crack-pots of various kinds.

They have one thing in common and that is their hatred of men who have the medical degree which they so wish they had themselves.

## Small Room Serves Milk Has Different Family Dual Purpose Taste for Chemist

Cushing, Okla.—(UP)—An oil executive here has a small room in his home which has an important dual purpose—to afford protection against possible bombing and the inevitable tornado.

Last April, a twister did strike at nearby Drumright, and the family of Oscar Anderson sought safety in the little concrete room. Anderson, president of the Big Four Petroleum Co., had the concrete block shelter buried three feet under the surface of the earth.

Access is through a stairwell from the house. Six metal and canvas bunks fold down from the walls for sleeping facilities. An electric fan circulates air through the room, and it may be operated by hand in case of a power failure. There are battery lanterns for light in an emergency.

Water is piped to the shelter by regular plumbing, but Anderson has drilled a 200-foot well for an auxiliary supply. The room also contains a six-week supply of food rations as well as picks, axes, shovels and hammers.

The Anderson children use the room for games.

Storrs, Conn.—(UP)—One glass of milk may taste the same as the next to you, but not to a University of California dairy chemist.

The research by W. G. Jennings may lead to closer control of the flavor of dairy products, members of the American Dairy Science Association learned at a recent meeting here.

Jennings has been analyzing dairy materials with a recently developed technique called gas-liquid partition chromatography. By this method minute amounts of material can be handled with sharp separation, according to Jennings.

Such precision is important in analyzing flavor constituents, he said, because they are ordinarily present in such tiny quantities.

## Unemployment At Lowest Level Since October

Salem—(UP)—Unemployment declined last month to the lowest level since October, the State Unemployment Compensation Commission has reported.

Only 16,000 persons were actively looking for work Aug. 1 as compared to 18,000 a month before and 20,000 a year ago. Some 8,200 were not covered by unemployment insurance.

About 80 per cent of the decrease since 1955 came from the Portland metropolitan area, but most other field offices noted decreases. Exceptions were Corvallis, Oregon City, McMinnville, Roseburg, Tillamook and Hood River. A slight increase in the number of idle workers in July was reported from Grants Pass, Klamath Falls, Milton-Freewater and Lebanon.

Payments to insured workers also hit a new low since last fall despite an increase of nearly \$5 in weekly checks. The July total was \$506,761 compared with \$690,479 last month.

The commission said most unemployment was caused by the mid-summer harvest lull and also a lumber slow-down caused by hot, dry weather.
