

Oregonian Finds Propaganda Fails To Deter Russians

Berlin — (U.P.) — Arden X. Pangborn, editor of the Oregon Journal, said yesterday Communist propaganda has failed to make the Russian people anti-American.

Pangborn spent 23 days in the Soviet Union on a study group tour sponsored by his newspaper and the World Affairs Council of Oregon.

"Ordinary Russians went out of their way to be nice to us," Pangborn said in an interview. "They were extremely friendly. They were eager to talk to us, particularly if they knew a little English."

"Apparently the anti-American propaganda the people have been fed for years is not working."

"Anti-American propaganda still is everywhere. However, Russian experts told me it has diminished a great deal and does not compare to the past."

"I wore a beret I picked up on my trip, a bow tie and carried a camera so people would know I was a foreigner. Everywhere we were approached by Russians wanting to talk."

friendly toward Americans."

Pangborn said anti-American propaganda in the Soviet Union has changed in that it no longer makes a blanket condemnation of all things American.

"Criticism now is specific," he said. "The Communists will take an excerpt from a speech by Secretary of State John Foster Dulles, distort it and then attack American policy. Dulles is their favorite whipping boy."

"The Russians have great respect for President Eisenhower. But that is their official line. They take the line that President Eisenhower is a good man who is badly advised."

In Russia the study group visited Leningrad, Kiev, Odessa, Yalta, Georgia and Moscow.

McKay Raps Demos On Conservation

Portland—(U.P.)—Doug McKay, Republican candidate for U.S. Senator, has blasted the Democratic party for dragging conservation into politics.

Speaking before an audience of veterans and conservationists at a meeting of the Veterans' Luncheon club, McKay outlined his 24-year conservation record and told his audience, "I would like to set a precedent that I hope you will ask other candidates to follow. Since conservation has become a political catchword, I think you are entitled to a look at your speakers' conservation records—if any."

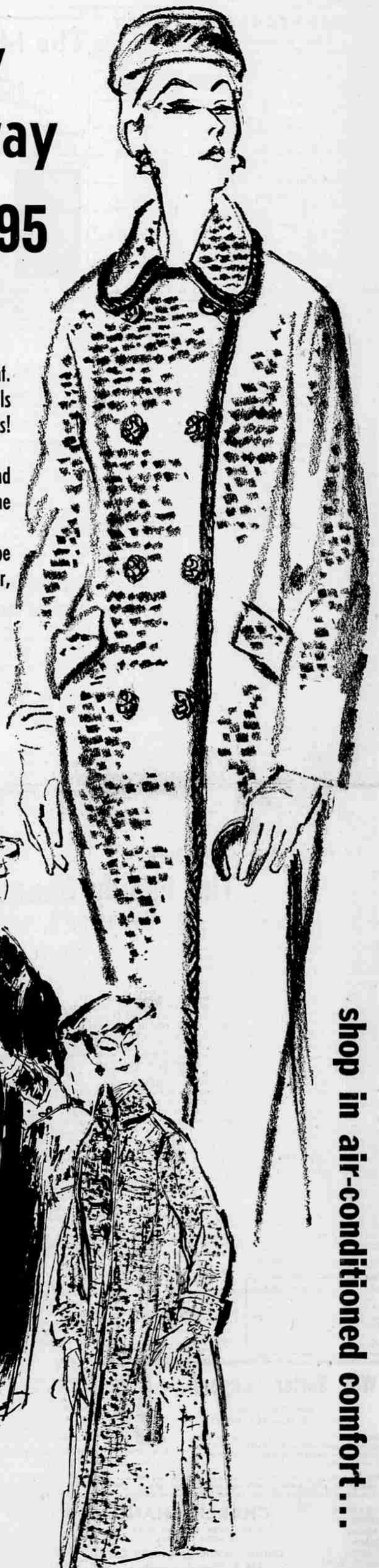
The former secretary of the interior urged a unified conservation program for Oregon, federal purchase of Klamath Indian lands, and wildlife refuge status for the Upper Klamath marsh.

In other speech highlights, McKay said he favored "appointment of a new assistant secretary in charge of fish and wildlife within the Department of Interior, with responsibility for unified operation of sports and commercial fish research and facilities."

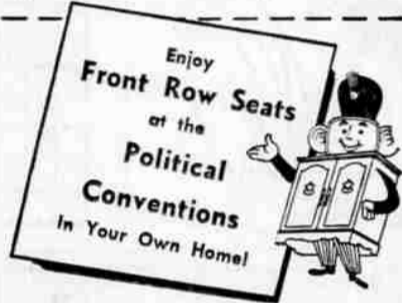
