Hiss Conviction Seen In 'Dump Nixon' Move

Trenton, N.J. — (U.P.) — The dump Nixon drive is the outcome of a four-year "underground movement" by persons miffed at Vice President Richard M. Nixon's part in prosecution of Alger Hiss, Sen. H. Alexander Smith (R-N.J.) charged Wednesday night. Smith, who said the Republican party "can't do without Nixon," charged that persons and groups opposed to jailing of Hiss on perjury charges have spent years laying plans "to undermine Nixon and destroy him." Those plans "started an underground movement in this country which was not necessarily Communist inspired," Smith said, "but certainly was inspired by those who felt Hiss should not have been convicted."

Sherwood Couple Hurt In Auto-Train Crash

Portland — (U.P.) — A Sherwood couple was injured but their two daughters escaped injury yesterday when their car and a freight train collided at a crossing on the Wilsonville-Newberg highway near Wilsonville, state police reported. Harold K. Baker, 45, and his wife, Agnes, 44, were brought to St. Vincent's hospital with multiple injuries. Their condition was not described as critical. The two daughters were shaken up. The car was demolished.

Funds Appropriated For Portland State

Portland — (U.P.) — An appropriation of an additional \$80,000 by the State Board of Higher Education, announced yesterday, assured immediate construction of a student center building at Portland State College.

Baldock Freeway Reopened To Traffic

Salem — (U.P.) — The Salem-Wilsonville section of the R. H. Baldock freeway was reopened to traffic today.

Wisconsin Fish Bait Looks Big Enough To Make Meal

Madison, Wis. — (U.P.) — If you want to catch one of Wisconsin's famous giant muskellunge, you'll bait you hook with a fish that looks big enough to make a meal in itself.

The return on your "investment" can be up to 60 pounds of one of the most ferocious game fish found in fresh water and the thrill of a lifetime.

Wisconsin officials, applying much the same theory to their efforts on behalf of the state's tourist industry, spend a quarter of a million dollars each year to

promote the state as a vacationland. The return is "conservatively estimated" at \$400,000,000 a year, or \$1,600 spent by tourists for every \$1 spent by the state government.

Only Educated Guess

J. H. H. Alexander, who heads the conservation department's recreation section, said there is no way now to make more than an educated guess at the state's actual tourist income. But with Michigan claiming a \$500,000,000 yearly tourist business, Alexander said the \$400,000,000 figure for Wisconsin was "conservative."

Harriman's Staff Given Polio Shots

Chicago — (U.P.) — Doctors inoculated the Harriman staff with Salk vaccine Thursday to protect them against a record outbreak of polio here.

Dr. Herman N. Bundesen, president of the Chicago Board of Health, took doctors and nurses to the headquarters in the Conrad Hilton hotel to administer the shots at the request of Gov. Averell Harriman of New York, aspirant for the Democratic presidential nomination.

Bunden personally supervised the inoculations.

The mass inoculations were set up after a personal telephone request to Bundesen from Harriman as the case count in the city's worst polio outbreak in history climbed to 653 for the year.

Alexander opened the section 20 years ago with a \$50,000 yearly budget and answered 17,954 queries from prospective tourists. Last year, the section answered 131,926 requests for information, and by June 1 this year had processed 98,740 inquiries, 18,000 more than at the same time in 1955. The budget for the work now is \$253,000.

The answer service is one of the agency's biggest jobs. Each query is answered with a colorful 26-page booklet outlining vacation advantages of nine sections of the state, a list of organizations that will give detailed information on each section, a road map, and a set of fishing regulations. If the letter writer asks about a special part of the state, he'll get additional literature supplied by tourist organizations there.

The recreation section also places advertising in newspapers, magazines and television to promote the state's tourist business. Postage, printing, ad space

and production cost about \$150,000 last year, Alexander said.

New Phase of Work

The agency went into an entirely new phase of work this spring when it opened a plush tourist information center in the Chicago loop. It is estimated that about 80 per cent of Wisconsin's out-of-state tourists come from the Chicago metropolitan area, and the patronage at the center seems to bear it out.

"The telephone rang the minute the installers hooked up the wires," Alexander said. "I answered and gave the man the information he wanted and then asked him how he got the number. He said he had copied it

off the door of the center more than a week before and had been calling every day since."

Wisconsin has some other important services it hopes will make friends. The conservation department puts out a weekly county-by-county report on fishing conditions aimed at week end travelers. The highway department issues maps periodically showing road construction and detours. And the State Public Service Commission clamps a Memorial Day to Labor Day ban on all heavy truck week end travel except for hauling of perishables.

Prison Term Meted In Derailment Try

Portland — (U.P.) — Dale Philip Cornwell, 20, Spokane, Wash., has been sentenced to two years in prison for attempting to wreck a passenger train.

Cornwell was sentenced by U.S. Judge Claude McCulloch who rejected a plea by the defendant that he be placed on probation so he could attend college and study engineering.

Cornwell pleaded guilty last month to attempting to wreck the Union Pacific City of Portland Demoliner at Boardman. Railroad ties were put on the track one day and scrap iron

another. No one was hurt and there was no damage as the locomotive knocked the material from the tracks.
