The Central Church of Christ, 608 North Central ave., was one of three beneficiaries in the will of Mrs. Sarah Gartner who died in Medford several years ago.

Mrs. Gartner left her money to the Adventist church, her nurse of many years, and the Central Church of Christ, to be shared equally.

Part of the money was spent for the residence at 523 North Bartlett st., which is used for a parsonage. The house, formerly owned by the Rev. Elmore J. Gilstrap, minister of the church, is of California type architecture with stucco exterior.

Besides purchasing the parsonage, the Church spent an additional part of the legacy to have the church building painted. The painting is now in progress. The church had not been painted since it was built approximately 14 years ago.

This is the first time for a number of years that the Central church has been out of debt. The mortgage on the church building was paid when the will was first settled.

Moslem's Bride Returns to Home

Palo Alto, Calif. — (U.P.) — A young mother, her "nightmare marriage" to a Moslem now a part of the past, prepared today to get a job as a bookkeeper to support herself and her baby.

Mrs. Helen Subbagh, 27, returned here Thursday night with her 22-month-old son, Paul, ending a 7000-mile flight from Baghdad, Iraq, and the Moslem household where she was a "slave."

Her romance began in Seattle where her husband, Abdul Subbagh, was formerly a student. She said her husband falsely claimed to be a Christian when they were married in a Methodist church.

She went with him to Baghdad. There, she said, he "changed." "Women in Iraq get no respect whatever," she said. "My husband tried to make me live like an Arab woman. When he got angry, I would be slapped, shoved, spit at and cursed..."

"In Iraq, men marry for one reason only—to have a slave." Mrs. Subbagh fled Iraq with her son, aided by the American consul in Baghdad.

Russians Refuse To Yield Kurile Islands

Moscow — (U.P.) — Japanese Foreign Minister Mamoru Shigemitsu met with Russian leaders Nikita Khrushchev and Nikolai Bulganin today but failed to shake their determination that the Kurile islands, taken from Japan after World War II, will remain Russian.

"They still stand on the same position. They said the islands are Russian territory," the dejected Shigemitsu reported. Some sources here believed the talk would be a decisive factor in the peace treaty negotiations, deadlocked over the question of Soviet occupied Japanese territory.

Three Measures Get Presidential Veto

Washington — (U.P.) — President Eisenhower has vetoed three bills including one that would have blocked an increase in rates charged by the Southwestern Power administration to electric cooperatives and other public agencies.

Congress passed the power bill on the last day of its recent session. It would have prevented the rate increases until after July 1, 1957.

Mr. Eisenhower said in vetoing it Thursday that sound management required that the federal government fix rates from federal projects which will return the taxpayers' investment, with interest, within a reasonable time.

Lyons, Kan. — (U.P.) — No election-year maneuver was the announcement of Lyons city officials of a 1.115-mill reduction in municipal property tax rate. It was the third straight year the levy has been lowered.
