No Medical Treatment For Fibroids

Women ask for medicine for "fibroid" tumors of the womb, and I have to tell them that I never heard of any drug that would help. Fibroids (more properly called myomas or muscle tumors) are much like the rest of the muscle of the womb. They are much like knobs on a potato—made of potato, but still they would be harmless. Similarly, fibroids are harmless unless they grow fast or grow so big they press on arteries, or cause flooding and anemia. These lumps on the uterus are so common that every third woman has one or more.

Expert gynecologists tell me that, as they have grown older and wiser, the have operated less and less often for fibroids. They seldom operate unless the woman is flooding so badly that she is becoming anemic. They tell me that they are very reluctant to remove the uterus of a woman under the age of 40; and they do not do it unless unusual circumstances compel them to do so. They no longer operate because of a fear of cancer because now they know that cancer very rarely grows in a fibroid.

I like this new stand taken by professors of gynecology because almost every mail brings me sad and often heart-rending letters from women who wish they could get their uterus back again. With its removal, some of the women lost their sexual feeling, and with this, their ability to hold their husbands. Others are terribly unhappy because they are now married to a husband who is very desirous of having a child, and they cannot give him the son he wants.

Operation Often Needed

When I write in this vein some of my surgeon friends write to say that often the operation is much needed. Of course it is; I am not talking of such cases; I am talking of youngish women whose only trouble is a tendency to sick headaches, or a beginning insanity, or a vague distress in the abdomen. In such cases

Home-Mixed Spray Kills Insects, Disease

Madison, Wis.—(U.P.)—A University of Wisconsin fruit production specialist says good results have come out of a home-mixed spray that kills both insects and diseases.

George Klingbell said the "dual-type" spray could be just the thing for home orchards and small fruit plantings. He said several Wisconsin fruit growers got good results from mixing insecticides and fungicides.

He said two tablespoons of malathion (25 per cent wettable powder), three tablespoons of methoxychlor (50 per cent wettable powder), and three tablespoons of captan (50 per cent wettable powder) mixed in a gallon of water does the job.

Klingbell said all three materials usually can be purchased in small quantities and should be mixed just before using.

He added that it is important to spray at the right time: two sprays before the bloom stage, another at petal fall, and then every 10 days or two weeks until 30 days before harvest.

Parents, Teachers Aid Mental Disease

Knoxville, Tenn.—(U.P.)—Parents and teachers are contributing more to the prevention of mental diseases than expert psychologists, according to Dr. E. Ohmer Milton.

The University of Tennessee psychologist said good mental health is based on sound self-esteem built up through little everyday contacts and experiences with important people.

This means, Dr. Milton said, that the real "mental physicians" are parents and teachers, whose opinions and actions are the basis of a child's first ideas about himself.

Teachers, in particular, the psychologist said, can form the first line of defense against mental illness by helping children to accept both their strengths and limitations and to live comfortably with themselves.

Those who feel sorry for themselves and those who try to impress others with their importance are on the verge of joining the ranks of the mentally ill, Dr. Milton concluded.

TV May Solve Problem Of Teacher Shortage

Berkeley, Calif.—(U.P.)—A high school physics classroom will be moved into TV station WQED at Pittsburgh next year in an attempt to help overcome the serious lack of high school teachers in the physical sciences.

A University of California professor, Harvey E. White, will give the telecast instruction to 15 high schools in the Pittsburgh area. The telecasting, undertaken with the cooperation of the Ford Foundation for the Advancement of Education and the Pittsburgh public school system, will give a void left since many high schools have dropped the teaching of physics from their curricula.

The telecasts will be filmed and thus can be used anywhere as needed.
