The Family Council

Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, a newspaper editor, a women's page editor and two newspaper writers. These consult with clergymen of all faiths and denominations. All letters are held in complete confidence.

Evelyn — He demands impossible proofs.

Allen — She's dangled a rival before me.

Evelyn — Allen and I were married just before he went into the armed services and we had a definite agreement that we would each be free to have friends of the opposite sex while we were separated without having to feel unfaithful and without having to account for our behavior when we came together again.

I have kept to my part of the bargain and have not even intimated that he should offer me any accounting. I assume that he was not self-denying when on leave, especially while in Europe, but I realize it would do no good to dig for painful knowledge when I had sanctioned in advance everything he might have done.

My husband, on the other hand, demands that I account for all the time we were separated. Although our pact was primarily his idea, I have the feeling that no amount of explanations would satisfy him, but that he would keep on probing and cross-examining and probably demand witnesses to prove every statement I made.

Because of this problem, I am thinking of leaving him.

Allen — It is not true that I initiated our pact. Evelyn really brought it about when she refused to go with me when I joined the armed forces. Half-jokingly and for the purpose of provoking her, I asked whether she would like it if I became entangled with another girl while away from her. At this point she said she would not mind if I accorded her an equal privilege. Out of that grew further discussion and our pact.

I would not pursue this questioning if she gave me any reassurance. She told me in her first letter after our separation that she was going out with a man, then she never alluded to the subject again. I am not suspicious, but she has dangled a rival before me and now refuses to give me any reassurance.
