Kogap Submits High Bid for Timber

Kogap Lumber industries of Medford was high bidder on two sales of forest service timber at oral auctions here this week.

The two sales, totaling 8,300,000 board feet, are in the Daley creek area of the Ashland ranger district and were made to salvage timber blown down in last December's storms.

Kogap's high bid on 2,700,000 board feet during the morning sale was \$58,075, and the high bid on 5,600,000 board feet during the afternoon sale was \$184,355. There were 40 separate bids at the morning auction, and 90 oral bids during the afternoon.

The next Rogue River National forest sale is scheduled for 2 p.m. Monday, Aug. 20, when 19,400,000 board feet of green timber in the Wizard creek area of the Union Creek ranger district will be sold at oral auction.
