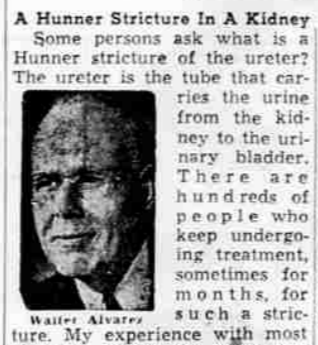

A Hunner Stricture in A Kidney

Some persons ask what is a Hunner stricture of the ureter? The ureter is the tube that carries the urine from the kidney to the urinary bladder. There are hundreds of people who keep undergoing treatment, sometimes for months, for such a stricture. My experience with most of these people has been that when I send them to a consulting urologist, he says he can't find a stricture. Then when I examine the woman carefully and talk to her I usually find that she has a nervous type of misery which runs from her face down to her foot on one side. Her distress is not limited to her loin, and it does not seem to have any relation to her kidney. Usually, in my experience, the dilations do not work a cure, and usually I find that the patient is a bunch of nerves.

Some of my urologist friends may write to tell me that there are such things as Hunner strictures, and that the cure scores of patients with them. Their argument could be that I see only the few persons who are not relieved by urologic treatments, and who may never have had anything wrong with the kidney. All I am sure of is that when the misery runs down all one side of the body, and when the patient is a bunch of nerves, it is doubtful if what looks like a stricture of the ureter is the cause of the pain.

ly healthy, a fertilized ovum remains in the tube and grows there. Usually, after two or three months, the embryo becomes so big that it breaks open the tube, and then the woman starts bleeding internally. With this, she is likely to become weak and terribly nauseated, with a pain in the lower part of her abdomen. Under these circumstances, unless the correct diagnosis is quickly made and a surgeon operates to remove the ruptured tube, the woman can bleed to death.

The important thing for a woman to know is that if she misses a couple of periods and then has a painful spell that looks something like an acute appendicitis, she must quickly call a surgeon and tell him that it may well be that she has been pregnant. This will help him greatly in making the diagnosis, and deciding whether or not to operate right off.

Ectopic Pregnancy

All women of child-bearing age should know that there is such a thing as ectopic pregnancy or tubal pregnancy. Normal, when the ovum or little egg is discharged from an ovary it is picked up by the end of the fallopian tube which runs out from the upper corner of the uterus or womb. The little egg is then carried by a wave-like motion towards the womb where, if it has become fertilized, it should become bedded down and start growing to form a baby. Somewhere along the way down the fallopian tube the little egg may meet a spermatozoon from the husband, and then it may become fertilized. If it isn't fertilized it will not grow.

Dewey Confident of Nixon Renomination

Washington (U.P.)—Former New York Gov. Thomas E. Dewey said following a meeting with President Eisenhower yesterday that he is "quite confident" that Vice President Richard M. Nixon will be renominated.

Dewey emphasized his continuing support for Nixon at the end of his 30-minute conference with the President. He said he and Mr. Eisenhower talked politics and about the Republican National convention in San Francisco next week.

But he would not say whether Nixon's future was discussed.

Then the lake was searched and the body was found.
