

# Raft, Half-Starved Passengers Arrive At Port in England

Falmouth, England — (U.P.) — Two bearded men and a raft arrived here from Canada today, victoriously ending an 88-day battle with the stormy North Atlantic.

The third member and captain of the crew inconspicuously met his shipmates in a taxi.

## Identity of Riesel Attacker Debated

New York — (U.P.) — The FBI and New York police disagreed widely today over identity of a murdered hoodlum suspected of the acid-throwing attack which blinded labor columnist Victor Riesel.

The district attorney's office said it was "seriously considering" exhuming the body of Abraham Telvi, 21, whom the FBI claims was killed by mobsters because acid burns on his face made him too "hot."

Telvi was found slain on the lower East Side on July 28. A police autopsy, however, disclosed no acid burns on the body's face. The autopsy also indicated a discrepancy in the size of the body compared to descriptions of the acid-thrower given by witnesses to the attack on Riesel.

Police "broke" their own case Monday with the surrender of Hugh Francis Drescher, 23, wanted for questioning about a wave of gangland executions which followed the acid-throwing incident. Drescher was an acquaintance of the murdered Telvi.

## Wheeler County Farmers Ruled Eligible for Loans

Washington — (U.P.) — The Agriculture Department today designated one Oregon county as an area where eligible farmers may receive emergency loans from the farmers home administration.

**Makes Arrangements**  
Expedition leader Henri Beaudot also of Montreal, boarded a passing ship as the raft neared the English coast Monday and came ashore to make final arrangements for the L'egare II's arrival here.

Beaudot took a taxi to the custom house quay early today and arrived just as the low-slung log raft waddled into the harbor behind the life boat.

The sea was calm and the sun glittered across the water as hundreds of Britons lined the docks to cheer the arrival. It was the biggest welcome in Falmouth since 1952, when Capt. Kurt Carlsen arrived here after his fight with the sea aboard the crippled Flying Enterprise.

L'egare II, a 220-square foot vessel made of cedar beams lashed together with rope, sailed from Nova Scotia May 24.

**Braved Near-Starvation**  
The three men from Montreal braved mountainous seas, near-starvation and thirst to prove that the Atlantic — like the Pacific — could be navigated with the most primitive equipment.

"We have been starving," said Beaudot as he stepped ashore on Monday night. "For the last 30 days we have been without food." He said he and his companions lived on fish and plankton, while rain was their only source of drinking water.

## Langley Assault Trial Due Sept. 7

Portland — (U.P.) — Multnomah County District Attorney William H. Langley will be tried in Municipal Court Sept. 7 on a charge and assault and battery brought by a newspaper photographer.

Date for the trial was set yesterday after a conference between Municipal Court officials and opposing attorneys. The charges against Langley were brought by Allan DeLay of the Oregonian. DeLay contends that Langley jerked his camera from him and smashed it against a wall.

## Body of Youth Taken From Columbia River

The Dalles — (U.P.) — The body of 19-year-old Alfred Ily was recovered from the Columbia river near here yesterday.

Ily drowned in the river a week ago when he fell while descending a ladder on the Oregon Trunk bridge near Celilo.

# McKay Lauds Langlie At GOP Convention; Wife Tells Her Views

San Francisco — (U.P.) — Douglas McKay, Republican candidate for the U.S. senate and former secretary of the interior, introduced Gov. Arthur B. Langlie yesterday evening at the Republican national convention.

Mrs. McKay said that the most important thing for a candidate's wife was to simply be herself and remember that the public wants to meet and see the wife as well as the candidate.

They include George L. Hibbard, Oregon City; Carl G. Helm Jr., La Grande; Hugh L. Biggs, Portland, and Andrew J. Newhouse, Coos Bay. They will succeed a quartet who will complete three-year terms on the 12-man board at the annual convention in Gearhart next month.

## 5 Seek Reelection For Ashland Posts

Ashland — Two city councilmen and three park commissioners, all incumbents, have announced they will run for reelection in the general elections this November.

Harry Morris and Ralph Koozer have petitions now circulating and will file with the city recorder soon. Koozer is head of Bagley Canning company, and has served a total of 12 years on the council, not consecutively. He has headed the finance committee and other council committees during his years there.

Morris is owner of the Oak Street Tank and Steel company and has been on the council four years. He has been on the budget and planning commission and is past president of the chamber of commerce.

Frank H. Barnhouse, Eldon Scripser and Archie Fries Jr., have filed with the city recorder for reelection to their posts as park commissioners.

Barnhouse and Scripser will be running for full four-year terms. Fries will seek to serve out two years of an unexpired term in the office to which he was appointed recently. The Ashland city government has a total of five park commissioners.
