Justin Smith, Selsor On PCC Roll of Honor

Justin Smith Jr., Medford, University of Oregon graduate last spring, is one of 32 senior athletes named to the Pacific Coast conference honor roll for 1956.

Also named was Bob Selsor, of University of California at Los Angeles, who has been playing baseball this summer for the Medford Cheney Studs semi-pro club.

Smith, an reserve officers' training cadet at U of O, will go on active duty in the Air Force on Sept. 9 and is to report to Lackland AF base, San Antonio, Tex., by Sept. 14.

At graduation time in June he was one of six senior cadets singled out for honors.

Selsor, who plans to enter the coaching field, started as an infielder this spring for the Bruins but became a regular pitcher when his mound talents showed.

Los Angeles — Thirty-two senior athletes who this year completed their undergraduate work at the nine Pacific Coast conference schools have been named to the conference honor roll for superior scholarship.

Three of the honored athletes had served as team captains during their playing days.

Two prominent track men were honored — Pat Coyle of Southern California, 1956 conference champion in both the 100 and 220-yard dashes, and Larry Anderson of California, PCC and NCAA pole vault champion in 1954.

Also included was Art Keith of Oregon State, three-time Pacific Coast wrestling champion in the 137-pound division.
