Libertyville, Ill. —(U.P.) — Adlai E. Stevenson denounced the 1956 Republican platform Saturday as "one of the rarest collections of already broken promises in modern political history."

The Democratic presidential nominee accused the GOP of "huckstering" and "slight-of-hand" by making "glib promises" in fields where the Eisenhower administration "has already failed."

Stevenson said the voter can reach "only one conclusion" if he reads the platform the convention adopted at San Francisco this week "with an eye to the fine print and the record of the past four years."

"The Republican party is still a stand-pat do-nothing party, and the Democratic party is still a forward-looking party that sets a big job ahead and does not fear to undertake it."

Stevenson blasted the GOP platform in a statement he said was based on a 25-page analysis of the document, prepared for him by the Research Division of the Democratic National committee.

Motorboat Struck By Tug in Columbia

Vancouver, Wash. —(U.P.) — A 14-foot outboard motorboat was struck by a tug in the Columbia river near Ellsworth landing Saturday, about five miles east of here, and a search was underway for a possible occupant of the craft.

Union, Reynolds Reach Agreement

Washington —(U.P.) — Officials of the United Steel workers and Reynolds Metals Co., reached agreement Saturday night ending the 25-day strike of 9,000 union workers in five states.

Charles Smith, chief negotiator for the AFL-CIO United Steel Workers, said the operation of the nine plants would resume "as soon as possible." But, he said, it would be a piece-meal operation for a while because of the difficulties of starting the plants again.

The three-year agreement carries a total hourly wage increase of 45.6 cents. A 9 1/2-cent hourly general wage increase is effective immediately. A 7-cent increase is effective July 1, 1957, and the wages will go up 8 cents an hour July 1, 1958.

The rest of the increase will be brought about by additional benefits, such as increased pensions, insurance benefits at lower cost, and an increased night shift differential and better allowance for vacations.
