

### Registration Fee Set for Students

Rogue River—Students registering for Rogue River High school should be prepared to pay a total enrollment fee of \$12.75, it was announced today.

Registration begins tomorrow and continues through Friday. All high school students must register and at the time of their registration they will also schedule classes for the coming year.

The enrollment fee includes \$6 book fee, \$1.25 towel fee for students taking physical education (all freshmen and sophomores except those excused by their doctors), \$1.50 for physical education books for boys only (\$1 of which will be refunded at the end of the year), and \$4 for student body cards which admit students to all home games free and to games away from home and motion picture theaters at student rates.

The high school will be open for registering students Wednesday from 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 4 p.m.; Thursday, 9 a.m. to noon, 1 to 4 p.m., and 6 to 8 p.m.; Friday, 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 4 p.m.

### Six Fined for Illegal Possession of Alcohol

Three young men and three juveniles were each fined \$15 in district court Monday for illegal possession of intoxicating liquor.

The girls were released to their parents by County Juvenile Officer Kay Crowell.

Also fined in district court yesterday were two 16-year-old boys and one 17-year-old boy, all of Butte Falls. They were arrested last Saturday charged with illegal possession of intoxicating liquor.

### GOP May Face Defeat, Sen. McCarthy Warns

Washington—(U.P.)—Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy warned today the Republicans may face a 1948-type defeat this fall if they pitch their presidential campaign on "sweetness and light."

The Wisconsin Republican, often at odds with the Eisenhower administration, said he thinks it "important" the Republicans win in November. But he indicated they will have to get tough to do it.

"If the election were held today, the Republicans would win hands down," he said in an interview.

But he said the Democratic standard bearers—Adlai E. Stevenson and Sen. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.)—are preparing to wage a "fighting campaign" while the Republicans appear to be planning a "high level, sweetness and light" battle.

## Federal Court Suit Over Colorado River Water Recessed; Will Resume Feb. 1

San Francisco—(U.P.)—Arizona's Federal Court suit over Colorado river water rights has been recessed until Feb. 1.

Simon H. Rifkind sent the attorneys home Monday to prepare for the next phase of the complicated legal battle.

The first phase has been completed—the presentation of proof by Arizona to back up its claim for a clear title to 3.8 million annual acre feet of water from the Colorado's flow.

The state presented 19 witnesses, used six attorneys, and filled more than 6,000 pages of legal transcript in its presentation. The number of days of trial

consumed was 39. The years may be numbered since 1952 when the state filed its suit as an original action in the U.S. Supreme Court.

Arizona has asked the court to grant it clear title to the water of the Colorado and its tributary stream, the Gila, and to enjoin California from using more

than 4,400,000 annual acre feet in the cities of Los Angeles and San Diego and on the farm lands of the Palo Verde, Coachella, and Imperial Irrigation Districts.
