The little girl suffered a broken leg and facial cuts and bruises; Mrs. Materie had bruises on the face, and he suffered face and back injuries. Extent of his injuries was not immediately known.

Accounts of the accident reaching here indicated that another car came onto the highway, forcing Mrs. Materie, who was driving, to swerve. The cars locked bumpers, spun around and struck a tree, it was reported. The accident was on Highway 99 north of Woodland.

The Materies were en route to Oakland, Calif., for a regional meeting of Montgomery Ward company executives. Materie is manager of the Medford store. Their son, Jimmie, 18, did not accompany them.
