The Central Point Beef Club walked off with the top honors in the livestock phase of the Jackson county 4-H fair completed last Saturday night at the fairgrounds. Selected the outstanding livestock club, this 4-H group not only had the grand champion steer but also the grand champion heifer female and the champion steer showman.

Patsy Charley was the owner of the grand champion steer and also the owner of the champion Hereford female. Dale Smith won the Don Nichols Showmanship trophy for the top steer showman. Dale was further named the outstanding exhibitor with purebred Herefords and received the Ed Pierce Hereford trophy. JoAnna Malloroy of Antelope was awarded the Allene Owens trophy as the outstanding showman with a beef female.

Ron Daugherty of Phoenix proved the outstanding sheep exhibitor and was awarded the George Nichols trophy.

In the swine division outstanding 4-Her exhibiting swine was Jim Frink who was awarded the Harold Frye Jr. Swine trophy. His youngest brother, Russell, as an outstanding exhibitor of Berkshires, was awarded the A. T. Lathrop Berkshire gilt.

Numerous dairy awards were presented to the various outstanding club members. Sally Mongold was awarded a show halter by the Rogue River Jersey Cattle club for exhibiting the champion registered Jersey, The George F. Lillis trophy was awarded to Dona Brown for the best Brown Swiss cow. As the outstanding exhibitor of Guernsey cattle, Bill Hubbard of Antelope was awarded the Jackson County Guernsey cattle club trophy.

A similar award, the Farhills Farms Holstein trophy was awarded to Jerry McDonald of Eagle Point. Jerry also won the

Around Hollywood

By DENIS & TERRY SANDERS Hollywood — (UP) — Bringing Norman Mailer's important and powerful novel, "The Naked and the Dead," to the screen is a tall order, and we're both proud we were selected to write the screen play for it.

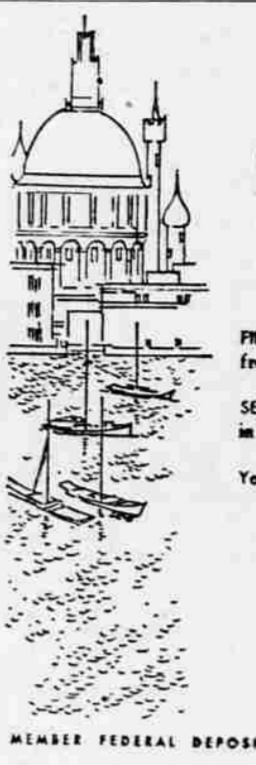
The novel itself is so powerful that, when it is rendered into visual scenes, each one becomes an even greater distillation of power. If we were to go along with the obscenity in the novel it would put too much shock value into these scenes and the viewers would be distracted from the story.

Screen obscenity can't be used, but even if it could we would delete it, anyway. The public would be reacting to the obscenity and not to the drama.

Remember how Ernest Hemingway handled it in "For Whom The Bell Tolls?" He had much the same situation and the dignity of the story stimulated him to create a new language. That would sound strange in a film, so we broke down the obscenity into two elements: the suppressed desire for a woman, and antagonism toward authority.

We took those two elements and presented them in their own separate ways. Wilson, the chief user of obscenity, has been changed into a man who has an overblown enjoyment of women instead of an overly erotic desire for them as in the book.

We found it helpful also to tone down the brutality of the
