Sliced Wild Boar in Wine Sauce Among 4,000 Fancy Foods in New York Display

New York — (U.P.) — Starry-eyed gourmets and drooling epicures scrambled this week to get a whiff and taste of such delicacies as sliced wild boar in wine sauce and kangaroo tail soup. These are among the more than 4,000 fancy foods and candies which have been on display here. More than 20,000 buyers for retail establishments across the country attended the second annual National Fancy Food and Confectionery Show, which featured the delicacies of 40 foreign nations. Russians Took Part Even the Russians took part in the show. They displayed caviar aimed at exciting the palates of capitalists. Trade sources said imports of foreign delicacies will hit a record high this year—possibly approaching the \$2 billion mark. Harry Lesser, president of the National Association For The

Specialty Food Trade, sponsors of the show, said rising imports of foreign delicacies dramatizes "America's growing interest in specialty foods." Lesser said the increase in demand for specialty food items reflects the fact Americans are traveling more and cultivating a taste for foreign delicacies. It also mirrors the growing trend toward informal home entertaining. Many Specialties Available Exhibitors at the show had many of their specialties available for tasting, and the gourmets present did not miss an opportunity to gobble down such things as "kissproof" garlic and shark soup. Smoked game birds from Britain were popular with the buyers. So was Germany's exotic entrant — canned sliced wild boar in wine sauce. The next time you have guests at your home see how they go for some good old-fashioned American hors d'oeuvres made with canned rattlesnake meat. The products on display came from such places as Hong Kong, Turkey, Japan, Holland, Chile, Poland and Madeira.
