

# Roseburg Eliminated From Legion Tourney

Bismarck, N.D. — (U.P.) — St. Louis and New Orleans were pitted against each other today in the American Legion Little World Series finals.

New Orleans gained the finals Thursday night with a 15-2 win over Roseburg, Ore. The loss was the second for Roseburg,

which was eliminated from the tournament and took third place, highest finish ever by an Oregon team.

New Orleans has suffered one defeat in the double-elimination tourney while St. Louis is unbeaten.

Winning pitcher Jim Harwell struckout 11 men and walked three in chalking up his second series victory. He was relieved in the eighth inning in preparation for possible mound duty in the St. Louis game.

New Orleans collected 14 hits off three Roseburg pitchers, and was aided considerably by seven errors of the Oregon club.

Roseburg led briefly, 1-0 in the second inning but New Orleans got three in the second and two in the third and was on its way.

It was only the eighth defeat against 31 victories for the Oregon squad for the season.

### Three Yanks Gain Quarter-Finals

Forest Hills, N.Y. — (U.P.) — Ham Richardson, Vic Seixas and Dick Savitt carried America's last hopes in the quarter-finals of the U.S. tennis championship today against three of the five Australians who are threatening to create the first all-foreign final since 1933.

Seixas was no better than an even choice against Aussie Ashley Cooper. Savitt insists he's not in shape to beat a cagey sharpshooter like little Ken Rosewall and only Richardson appeared to have enough power to pull out a victory against southpaw Neale Fraser.

While the last three surviving Yanks were fighting to stay alive, tournament favorite Lew Hoad figured to win easily against Roy Emerson, in a match washed out Thursday.

In the women's division, Althea Gibson of New York was matched against Darlene Hard of Montebello, Calif., and Mrs. Dorothy Head Knode of Forest Hills against Mrs. Betty Pratt of Jamaica, B.W.I., with places in the semi-finals at stake.

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## 45 Oregonians Die On Highway in August

Salem — (U.P.) — Forty-five persons died in Oregon traffic accidents last month, boosting the eight-month total to 269, the State Traffic Safety Commission reported today.

The August toll, still tentative, is the highest recorded for any month so far this year. The eight-month toll represented seven more deaths than were reported for the same period.

State Motor Vehicle Director Warne H. Nunn said two southern Oregon accidents, each of which killed five people, were responsible for boosting the August count.

"If those two accidents had been avoided," he commented, "the August count would have been a relatively low 35."

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
