

## Stumbos Receive Second Nibble

The Stumbo brothers of Wolf Creek appear to have a second "nibble" for their 16 by 100-foot stretch of property crossing U. S. Highway 99 north of Glendale in Douglas county.

A letter has been received from an "interested party" stationed with the Armed Forces in Tokyo, Japan, by Leslie L. Kellow Real Estate company in Medford. The Stumbos listed the property "for sale" with Kellow's company last week.

**From Medford**  
Kellow informed the Mail-Tribune today the letter was from a long-time personal friend, C. H. Ernst, who read a news story about the property and antics of the Stumbos in the Pacific Stars and Stripes, newspaper published for servicemen.

In the letter, Ernst said, "I'm writing to inquire the price on the home site with 'highway frontage' and backage you have advertised in the Stars and Stripes."

**Carpenter Interested**  
George Potucek, business agent for Carpenters Local 2067 of Medford, said Wednesday trustees of the organization are also "investigating" the property.

The three Stumbo brothers, Robert, Allan and Harry, and a cousin, Clair Stumbo, recently discovered the state failed to make settlement for the property before construction of the highway began in 1947.

The state highway department has offered them \$100 plus 6 per cent interest since 1946. The state has also indicated condemnation procedures may be started if clear title to the property can not be otherwise obtained.

## Lipman Wolfe Firm Bought in Portland

Portland — (U.P.) — Local interests headed by William E. Roberts and Harold Wendell have purchased Lipman Wolfe and Co., one of Portland's largest department stores, and its new store in downtown Salem.

Roberts will be chairman of the board and Wendell president, putting Lipman's under a local corporation and ending Lipman's status as part of a large department store chain.

It was controlled since 1925 by National Department Stores, a New York corporation with a 16-store chain acquired in 1935 by South American Gold and Platinum Corp.

Though no price was announced, retail sources placed a value of \$4 to \$5 million on the combined Lipman operations.

Roberts also is president and a director of the family-owned Roberts Brothers Corp., which has a large downtown Portland store and branches in Salem, Corvallis and Eugene.

Wendell previously was president of Lipman's as a subsidiary of National Department Stores and remains as operational head under the new ownership.

### Expert Advice on Main Dish Freezing

Preparing main dishes such as beef pie, chicken-corn casserole and the like for storage in the home freezer can be a real time-saver and convenience provided the homemaker looks out for a few "do's" and "don'ts" for success in this modern way of storing food.

Food specialists in the U. S. Department of Agriculture's Research Service recently made up a number of main dishes experimentally and judged the food for eating quality after different periods of time in frozen storage.

Here are special pointers based on their conclusions. Do leave vegetables and macaroni dishes slightly underdone for freezing. If cooked well-done, these foods are likely to be too soft when reheated.

Do freeze meat pies or turnovers with pastry crusts unbaked. Crusts baked after freezing, in the experiments, had fresher flavor and were more flaky and tender than those baked and then frozen.

Do cool quickly a cooked main dish that is to be frozen by setting the uncovered pan of food on ice or in very cold water. A metal pan is preferred for cooling as it conducts the heat away from the food rapidly and is not likely to break. Quick cooling stops the cooking and so helps to keep the natural flavor, color and texture of the food. It also retards or prevents growth of bacteria that may cause spoilage.

**Cream Style Corn**  
Enjoy fresh corn cut from the cob for a change. Select usual full tender ears of corn; husk and remove silk. Cut corn off cob, scraping cobs in one direction only to get best milk and pulp from cob. Turn into saucepan with 1/2 cup boiling water, 1/3 cup milk, 2 tablespoons butter, margarine or bacon drippings, 1/2 teaspoon sugar; add salt and pepper.

Slowly bring to simmering point; cover and cook a few minutes, stirring occasionally. Blend 1 tablespoon flour with 2 tablespoons water and stir into corn, stirring to thicken. If you've some canned pimientos handy, rice a couple and add for color, flavor, texture.

**Grandma's Pet Pearalilli**  
Putting up some of those plentiful pears? Here's a fine easy recipe with old-fashioned flavor. Makes about 4 pints of zesty relish for serving with hot or cold meats. Recipe has been carefully worked out so that the measured amount of beet or cane sugar used gives just-right sweetness.

Takes about 5 pounds (15 large) firm ripe pears. Put unpeeled, cored pears through coarse knife of foodgrinder. Measure 7 1/2 cups. Grind 1 medium-size green pepper and two canned pimientos fine.

In preserving kettle combine pears, pepper, pimientos, 1 1/2 cups gold seedless raisins, one tablespoon grated lemon rind.

1 1/2 cup lemon juice, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon cayenne, 1/4 teaspoon ginger, 1/2 teaspoon each of whole cloves, allspice (whole spices in dampened cheesecloth bag). Stir in 4 cups beet or cane sugar, mixing thoroughly, bring to boil and cook on medium heat about 20 minutes or until thickened, stirring often. Pour into hot sterilized jars; seal at once.

**Tropical Freeze**  
Tropical freeze is a dessert that's sure to please. Takes only minutes to make this exciting frozen dessert. No second beating or extra work. Five generous servings.

Combine 2/3 cup fresh orange juice, 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice, 1/4 cup pineapple juice, 1 teaspoon grated orange peel and 1 cup sugar. Whip 1 cup whipping cream until stiff. Fold juice mixture into whipped cream. Pour into freezer tray and freeze, stirring it once when half frozen.

**Something Frosty?**  
For drink or dessert, make chocolate shake by adding scoop of chocolate ice cream to 3/4 cup chilled chocolate milk; heat or shake smooth.

For a coffee cooler, add chocolate or coffee ice cream to iced strong coffee and beat, shake or stir vigorously.

For buttermilk frost, shake or beat big scoop pineapple or orange sherbet with 3/4 cup chilled buttermilk.

**Best Buys in Markets**  
The warm fields of California and Arizona keep our nation supplied the year 'round with the world's most popular salad green. Iceberg head lettuce, West Coasters think so highly of salads that we frequently start the meal with them at dinner time; use a generous salad as main course for lunch or at supper time. Today's markets offer an abundance of fresh vegetables for going into salads uncooked and crisp in ways like these:

Beets, shredded, add color to a green salad. Sprinkle over after tossing and just before serving to keep color from spreading.

Cabbage, shredded into the salad bowl adds crispness and flavor to other greens; goes into cole slaws with sour cream dressings that are a special treat with fish, shellfish.

Carrots, shredded, chopped or ground are the sunshine in any salad. Celery and green pepper are fine flavor accents for carrots. Carrots shredded and added to cottage cheese make a fine salad when a bit of mayonnaise is added along with a few raisins.

Cauliflower in snowy white bits bring contrast in taste and texture to almost any salad.

Celery goes with everything. Use lots of it and add a few finely cut top leaves.

Cucumbers, sliced, unpeeled, are especially popular when combined with green onions and radishes in a tossed green salad. Cucumbers in seasoned sour cream dressings in a vinegar dressing; slivers of raw cucumber in the relish dish along with carrot sticks, celery hearts.

Green onions, tops and all, can be cut fine into any salad. Green peppers add color, crisp texture and fragrance to all vegetable salads.

Radishes, sliced paper thin are high in color and flavor.

Snap beans are seldom remembered for salads. Try adding a few snips of them to next salad.

Tomatoes cut into wedges are right at home in any salad bowl combination. It's best to add the tomatoes after the salad has been tossed.

Zucchini, sliced thin, adds pleasing texture and piquant flavor to green salads.

Lettuce should be trimmed as soon as you get it home. Never soak lettuce. Simply rinse under running water. Drain or shake off excess water; store in covered container in refrigerator. Use as cups for salad, cut in wedges, tear or break into bite-size shreds.

## Reds Deny Backing Dulles Suez Plan

London — (U.P.) — Russia today denied growing reports that Soviet Foreign Minister Dmitri Shepilov offered to back the Dulles Suez plan if the West would abandon the Baghdad pact. "Cock and bull," said the Soviet government organ Izvestia in an editorial broadcast by Moscow Radio. "Malicious invention."

Reports have circulated with increasing frequency in London that Shepilov broached the offer to Secretary of State John Foster Dulles in three private meetings held during last month's Suez conference.

Shepilov's attitude on the Suez issue suddenly hardened midway through the conference as though he had suffered a private rebuff.

The Jewish Observer and Middle East Review quoted such reports in its Aug. 31 issue under the headline "Shepilov was prepared to ditch Egypt." The weekly said he had "proposed a deal."

"The Soviet government was prepared to subscribe to an American interpretation of an international authority for the canal," it said. "In return, Shepilov asked for just one gesture of goodwill; the United States should jettison the Baghdad pact which the Soviet Union felt was at the root of Middle East unrest."
